At four o'clock next Sunday afternoon there will be a community service addressed by Dr. Frederick F. Shannon, the successor of Dr. Gun-saulus at The Central Church, Chicago, to which the citizens of Highland Park are cordially invited.  
The Young People's Society has arranged a supper and program for all past and present members next.  
On next Monday morning, at ten o'clock, the Presbytery of Chicago will meet at the Presbyterian Church and will be entertained to luncheon by the people of the Church. In addition to the members of the Presbytery the members of the Session of the Church are invited to the luncheon.  
On Tuesday afternoon at two thirty the women of the Church will observe the anniversary with the following program. They extend a hearty invitation to the women of the other Churches of Highland Park.

Each organization is entirely governed by the people of the respective city.  
"A Community Service organization is the property of the entire community, and aims to include every man, woman, boy and girl in its activities."  
"Activities are chosen by the local Community Service committees for their wholesome recreational values, their health-giving values, their educational and cultural values."  
The local committees, in formulating the programs, aim to offer such an array of activities that everyone in the community will find favorites that will inspire them to participation, and so increase the happiness and health of their lives, their joy of living. But the committees do not stop there. Any additional activities that persons call for are added to the list.  
"Included in the most popular activities are: Athletic leagues, community singing, musical societies, bands and orchestras, dramatics, pageants, social gatherings for social games and other pastimes, public discussions, open forums, various forms of clubs for men, women and children, educational classes, etc."  
"Community Service organizations bring our children together, bring our families together, bring us all together. The result of its activities, the creation of neighborhood groups, the pooling of community resources, is a community spirit and a better citizenship. This makes an increase in neighborliness, the development of new friendships, which might never have existed. All the values can be boiled down to this interpretation: greater happiness and health, a more abundant life because of new opportunities for self-expression for the individual and for a broader social life for the whole community."
