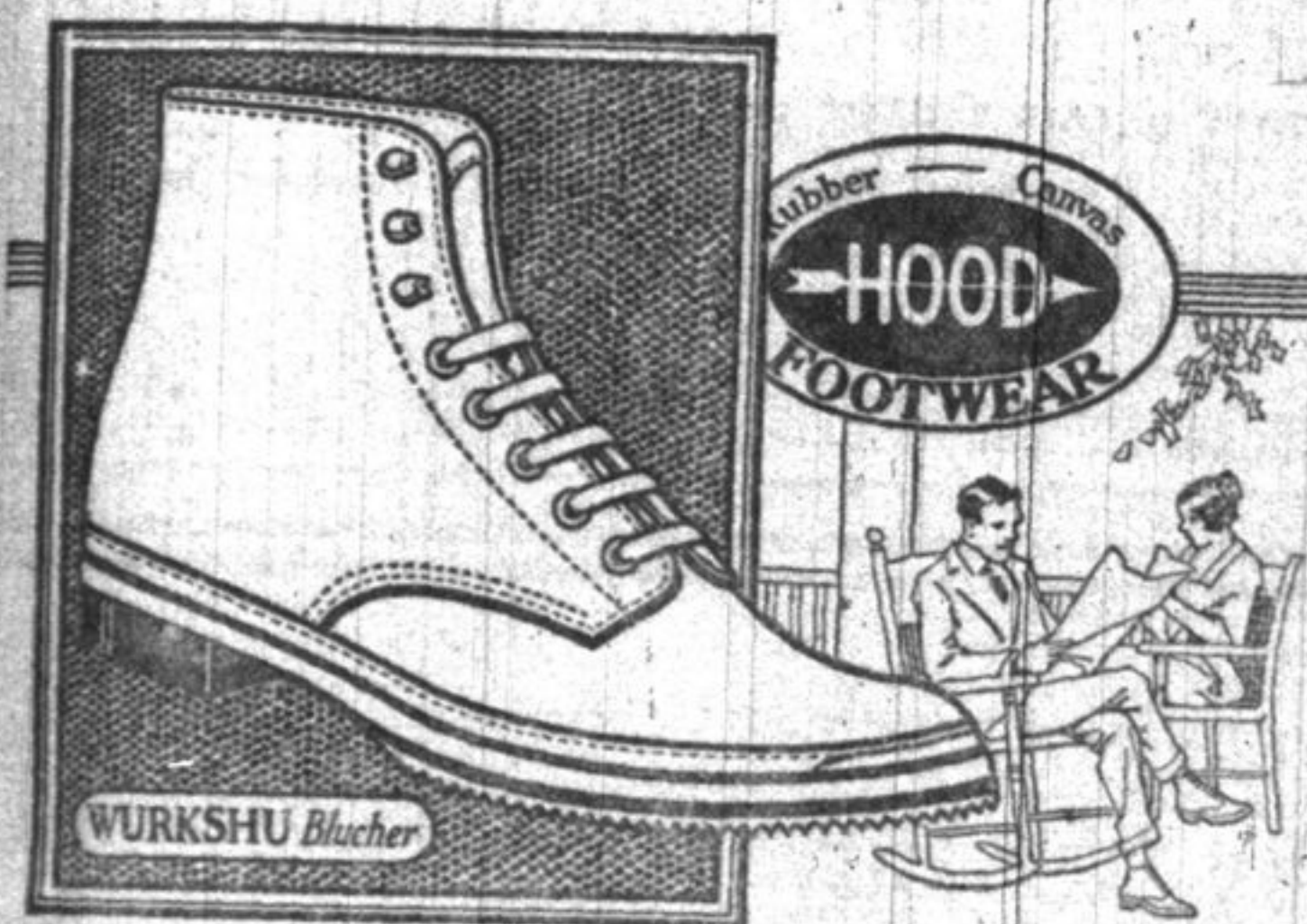

**HEAT WAS FATAL TO LIBERTYVILLE MAN**

Clement Hamel Found Dead by Physician; Inquest Held Last Thursday

One of the first cases of fatal heat prostration to occur in Lake County developed Wednesday night, July 6, shortly after 5 o'clock when Clement Hamel, aged 72 years, owner of a farm about three miles northeast of Libertyville, succumbed. He was overcome about noon while raking hay in the field.

Following this sunstroke Mr. Hamel went to the house and lay down, believing that his illness would pass in a short time. At four o'clock he felt a little better and got up. He still was weak, however, and his wife volunteered to go out and milk the cows. She returned to the house about five o'clock and was startled to find her husband dying. He expired a few moments later. Dr. Galloway was summoned, but he asserted that the aged man had been dead several minutes before he arrived.

Mr. Hamel formerly lived in Waukegan and forty years ago or more was employed by Attorney Searles, then one of the best known residents of the city. For the last score or more of years he and his wife had been living on the farm in the town of Libertyville.

Mr. Hamel was born in Canada, being one of a family of twenty-two children. Besides his brothers and sisters he leaves his widow and an adopted son.

**COUNTY ASKS BIDS FOR NEW PAVEMENT**

Proposed Improvement Between Wauconda and Volo, and North From Barrington

Bids for the construction of two sections of concrete highways in Lake county, totalling about six and a half miles, will be opened July 19, at 2 p. m., at the courthouse. The project is a part of the county bond state aid road propositions, the estimated cost is \$177,945. Bids were advertised for last week by County Superintendent of Highways Charles E. Russek.

Section 6, Cuba township. The proposed improvement includes Section N. Cuba township, from Barrington north to a distance of 1.35 miles, and Section O, from the north limits of Wauconda to Volo, 4.6 miles, connecting with Belvidere road.

The engineer's estimate on section N is \$89,950 and the proposal calls for an 18-ft. concrete highway with six ft. earth shoulders. The estimate for Section O is \$137,995 and the plans are identical except as to distance.

Bids are to be received by the road and bridge committee. A deposit of \$10 must be made to obtain plans, and all bids shall include proposals for cement, although the county reserves the right to furnish it. A certified check equal to 5 per cent of the bid is required.

All work must be done according to state highway specifications as modified by supplemental county specifications.

**"PAT" CROWE TO DO REFORM WORK**

"Pat" Crowe, ex-kidnaper and ex-convict, is planning to carry on reform work in the Boston underworld. Crowe at one time was a resident of Lake county. Following the sudden period of reform, which he went thru some years ago, he came to Highwood and there rented a building which he opened up as a health resort. Crowe conducted the place for some time but did not make a success of it. And after he closed it up, he went in the greener field and soon thereafter was heard of again in two of three scandalous incidents.

Crowe, now apparently has landed a soft job.

**PAUL BIEN FOUND GUILTY LAST WEEK**

Proprietor of Lakeside Hotel at Fox Lakes Testifies in County Court

Paul Bien, proprietor of the Lakeside hotel at Fox Lake, who testified he had seven bartenders, who were kept busy drawing near beer on Decoration Day, was found guilty on three counts late Friday afternoon by a jury in the county court.

Bien was convicted on two sales and for keeping intoxicating liquor for sale. The jury returned the verdict at 5:45 o'clock after being out only a short time.

The beer was hauled to Fox Lake from Trevor, Wis., via auto truck and was labelled "non-intoxicating."

Bien was on the witness stand in his own behalf and from his evidence it was learned he does a thriving business during holidays. He testified his seven bartenders sold 14 barrels of beer in two days, but he claimed it was non-intoxicating.

Bien testified he formerly was in the butcher business in Chicago. He has been operating the Lakeside hotel for three or four years.

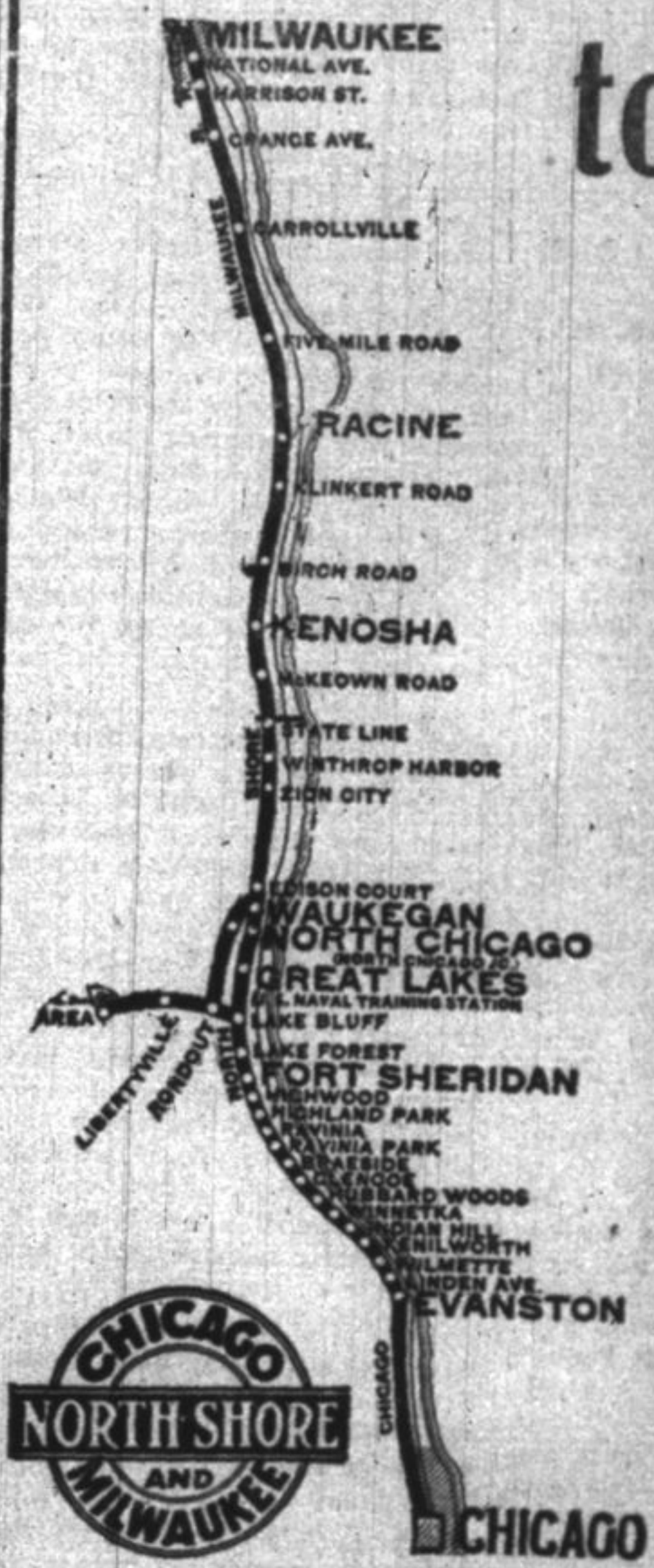
