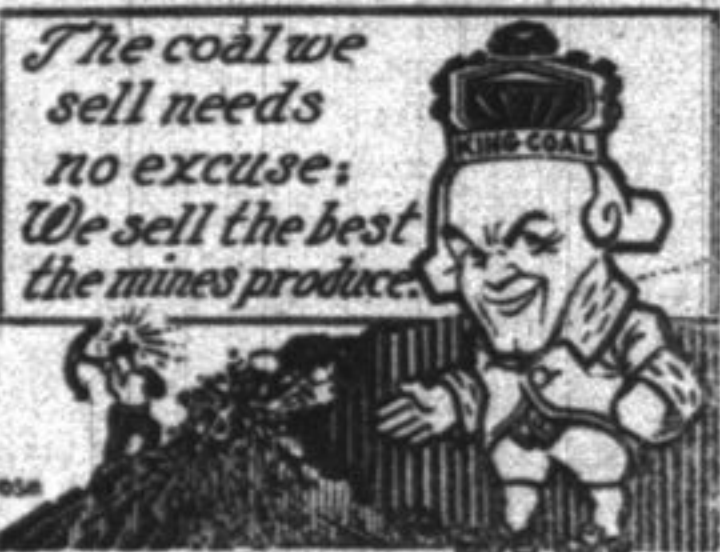

Generally speaking there are four forms of government possible for the human race. Theocracy, oligarchy, monarchy and democracy. God instituted theocracy and undoubtedly intended that this should be the form of government for the entire world, but men refused to have God to be their Ruler and substituted in His place men. The world has plunged on for thousands of years reeling and reeking in blood and slaughter. Contracts, compacts, alliances, leagues and covenants have been made again and again, only to be broken when selfish interests demanded upon the part of the contractors. Leagues of nations, limitations of armaments are good, but in the long run they will amount to little or nothing because the nations have rejected and are rejecting the Prince of Peace, Jesus Christ. If men will but go to God's Word and come down from some of their high-brow conceptions of themselves they will soon learn the futility of trying to run this world without Jesus Christ. So far as we are able to learn from those who were present, there was not one prayer, not one sentence, in the recent League of Nations pact in Paris which recognized God in the affairs of the world. President Harding before his election said that the League of Nations never would work because those who were responsible for making the contract left God off their program. It remains to be seen whether he will allow a similar mistake to be made at the coming conference in Washington. The book of Daniel, written at least six hundred years, before the Christ entered the earth, gives a bird's-eye-view of conditions as they will transpire. Babylon, Medo-Persia, Greece, Macedonia and Roman Empires have all passed. The Divine Announcer says that at the end of these the God of Heaven shall set up a Kingdom that shall never cease; the Divine Stone will smite the world. Jesus Christ came but the world crushed him. How long will it be before He crushes the world?

Will his coming the second time be sudden, will it be visible? If He came, where would He set up his government?
