CONVICTED BURGLARS ASK FOR PROBATION

Men Who Attempted to Steal Whiskey at Blodgett Seek to Escape Prison

Charles Johnson and William Moir, Chicago men who were convicted by a jury in circuit court of having attempted to steal two barrels of whiskey from a freight train near Blodgett over a year ago, are making a desperate attempt to escape a term in prison through obtaining probation.

Moir was the first to file his petition for release on probation. As a result Judge Edwards withheld sentence temporarily, wishing to decide on the probation matter first. Johnson was sentenced to serve from one to twenty years in the state prison at Joliet.

Evidently the severity of the sentence came as a surprise to him for he also has filed a petition for release on probation. If Judge Edwards decides to grant the petition it will be necessary for him to set aside the prison sentence.

But there is nothing to indicate that the court is so inclined. It is known that State's Attorney Smith

will contest the action of the convicted burglars. He will ask, it is said, that the sentence in the case of Johnson be allowed to stand and that Moir also be sentenced. Judge Edwards is expected to enter a ruling next Monday. The action was to have been taken up this week but has been postponed for one week. Johnson was shot by one of the railroad officers when he sought to escape after he was caught in the act of removing the liquor from a freight car. It is said he was injured permanently as a result.

SUBSTITUTE FOR SYRUPS
