Buildings for "Fair Oaks" Have

"Fair Oaks," Holy Child High school for girls, 988 N. Sheridan road, Waukegan, Illinois, opens September 12, 1921.

The buildings on the recently purchased estates are being remodeled that they may be better for school purposes.

The location is ideal and the magnificent grounds afford ample space for all school sports. "Fair Oaks" is easily reached either by the Northwestern railroad or the North Shore Electric. The street car marked "Sheridan Road" to which transfer may be made from the Electric at North Chicago or at Washington and Genesee streets, Waukegan, makes its final stop at the north entrance to the school grounds.

Provision is being made for day pupils and a limited number of weekly boarders.

The high school will be conducted by the Sisters of the Holy Child Jesus whose mother-house is at Sharon Hill, a suburb of Philadelphia, Pa. These sisters also have a high school at 6585 Sheridan road, Rogers Park, Chicago.
