Labor Day Game

The Labor Day affair at Lake Forest was a different tale. Kerrigan had left the game purposely the day before to save himself for the Labor Day fracas, and although the boys said he didn't have a thing but his uniform and a glove still he was mighty stingy in the pinches. In the second inning Eddie Therrien, Fred Glader and Elmer Therrien got home runs in succession. The boys scored four runs in this inning and as they had put over two in the first they had a comfortable margin. But Elmer Therrien's home run was fatal for him, as he was pitching, and before he could get his wind back from running the circuit, the Lake Foresters pounded him for six runs and he retired in favor of Fred Glader. The home runs were almost fatal to Howard Huber, genial business manager for the Y. M. C. Early in the season Howard told the team that he would put up a standing offer for all season of five dollars for each home run hit by a member of the team. On Sunday, George Rudolph collected five smacks from Howard, and when the trio of homers came in rapid succession on Labor Day it took the combined efforts of the team with the aid of a pulmotor to resuscitate Howard.

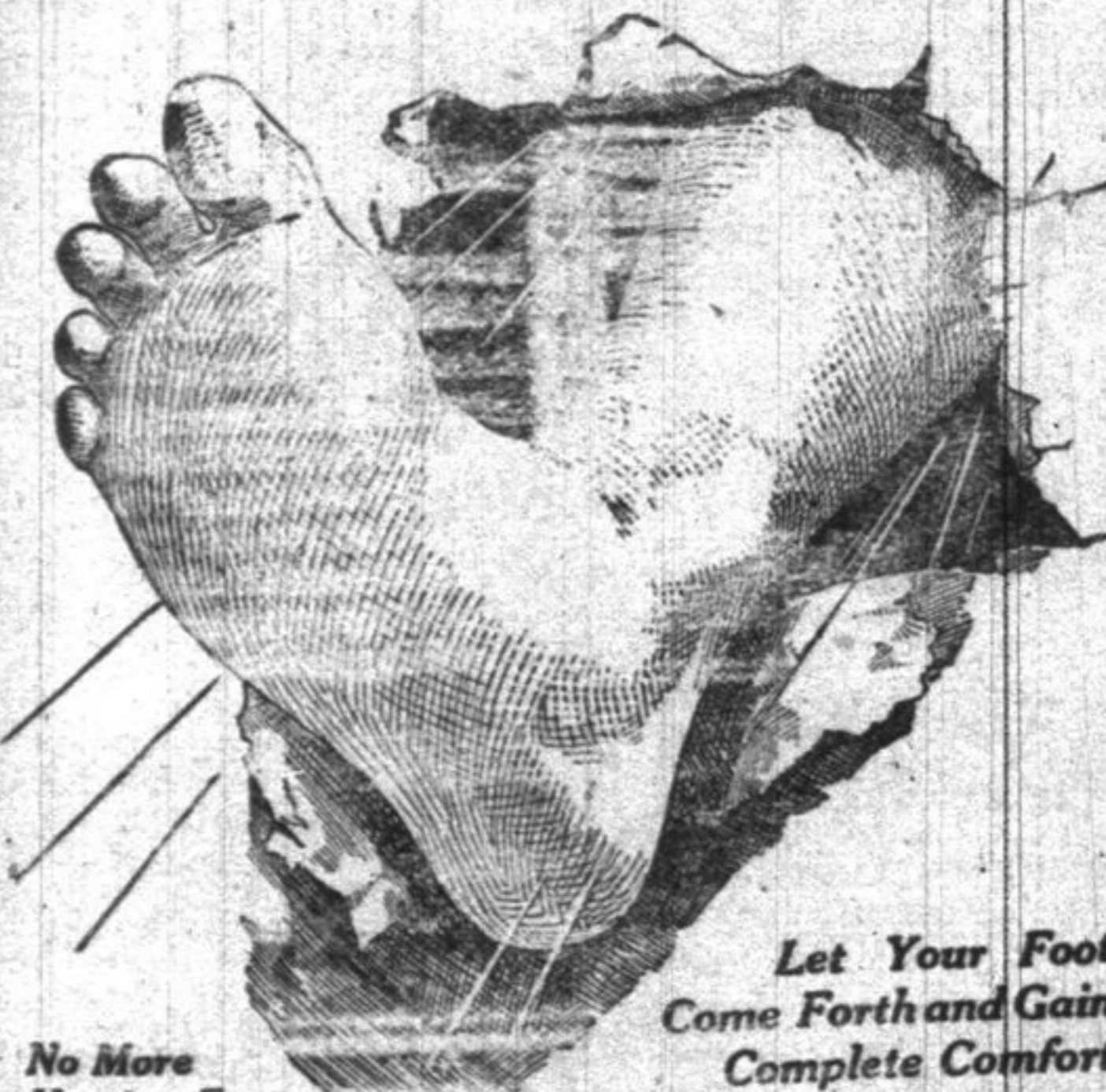
