STATE AUTO OFFICER WARNS VIOLATORS

to Enforce Law Requiring Licenses for Cars and Chauffeurs

Under the new law which gives Secretary of State Louis L. Emmerson authority to appoint investigators with power to make arrests for violation of the automobile laws, round-up of violators was begun in Lake county last Friday. Investigator D. C. Merritt of Lake county is in charge of the sprvey.

In most counties where investigators have been sent to date The Ladies' Aid society will meet they have found great laxity in the observance of this section of the law. Under the law no boy under eighteen years of age is permitted to drive a car or truck for hire, and all persons who drive cars or trucks for hire must obtain a chauffeur's certificate from the secretary of state. This applies to drivers of delivery trucks as well as to drivers of taxi cabs, service cars or private chauffeurs. The owners of the truck not operated for hire, of course, is permitted to drive without a chauffeur's license, but anyone driving a car not his own for compensation must have a chauffeur's license
