**KLINDSWORTH GETS 3 YEARS IN PRISON**

Former Waukegan Police Officer Convicted on Bad Check Charge

John Klindworth, former Waukegan police officer, erstwhile taxi-driver and later a member of State's Attorney Smith's "sponge squad," will serve three years in the state penitentiary of Pennsylvania, according to word received by his wife in Waukegan. Klindworth was convicted on a charge of passing a worthless check.

Klindworth disappeared from Waukegan about the middle of last July. He took with him his mortgage car, the mortgage being held by Charles Barstow. The automobile was later found at Fredonia, N. Y. Klindworth was arrested at Erie, Pa.

About the same time Mrs. Klindworth in Waukegan swore out a warrant for the arrest of her husband on a charge of wife and child abandonment. Sheriff Green communicated with the authorities at Erie and informed them that in case they were not able to hold Klindworth on the bad check charge they would like to be notified so that he could be brought back here to face trial. He was assured that this would be done. The Erie officials, however, asserted that they had a good case against the former Waukegan policeman and believed they would be able to obtain a conviction.

Mrs. Klindworth is said to have expressed no regret when she learned of her husband's sentence. "Too bad they didn't send him up for 20 years," she is alleged to have said.

**CHICAGO MOTOR CLUB MARKS DANGER SPOTS**

Twenty Signs Erected by Road Survey Man; Others Coming Later

Work of marking the highways of Lake County with caution signs was begun last week by the Chicago Motor Club, under the direction of John H. Graham, road surveyor of the highway department of the big Chicago motoring organization.

The standard signs of the club are eighteen by eighteen inches steel, mounted on a nine-foot steel post set in the ground a foot and a half. The background of the sign is a strong yellow, with red and dark blue letters and characters. The series being erected include warning for curves, dangerous crossings, schools and danger spots.

After the principal spots have been selected by Mr. Graham and William Hamlett, manager of the Lake County branch of the Chicago Motor Club, the work of erecting the signs will proceed by the sign-posting crew, which will follow Mr. Graham, who will then move on to Kane County and continue the work of sign-posting all the counties adjacent to Cook County.

So far this season the Chicago Motor Club has sign-posted most of the main highways leading out of Chicago as well as marking the State highways in all directions.

In all, Mr. Graham says he will be allowed to erect but twenty danger signs in Lake County on the present trip but suggests that any others be noted now and on his return he will place additional signs where needed.

**WAUKEGAN MAN IS BURIED IN MID-OCEAN**

Former Employee at Tannery Is Victim of Mad Man on Atlantic Liner

The thrilling story of how Emil Karl Kanet, a Waukegan young man, fought a vain fight for his life with an infuriated maniac while both of them were on a steamship in mid-ocean, finally losing his life when a bullet from the madman's revolver pierced his heart, and how his assailant then wounded another man after which he turned the gun on himself and dropped dead with a bullet in his brain, has just been received by Waukegan friends.

Up to a year or two ago Kanet was employed as a chemist at the Gries-Pfleger tannery in this city. Since he left here he has been employed by the Goodyear Rubber company at Akron, Ohio.

Recently he obtained a leave of absence to return to Austria to visit his parents who he had not seen since before the war. He was returning to America on the Steamship George Washington when he met his death. The attack was made by a cabin mate whom, according to accounts received here, went suddenly insane. Kanet fought for his life but in vain against his powerful, armed assailant. Another who came to his rescue was shot down and seriously wounded by the maniac before he ended his own life.

Funeral services were held and both the bodies buried at sea.

During the years he lived at Waukegan Kanet made many friends who were shocked to learn of his tragic death. He was a man of exceptionally high principles. He made his home at the Y. M. C. A. while in Waukegan.

He tried repeatedly to become an American citizen but failed because of the federal ruling which would not permit "alien enemies" to become citizens while the United States was at

war with Germany and Austria. Recently he received his full citizenship papers.

Formerly the young men used humbly to ask the privilege of calling on the girls, but now they descend to appear when urgently summoned on the telephone.
