1,982 Persons Killed; 49,550 Injured in Cook County Last Year

If 1982 persons, including 497 children, were killed and 49,550 persons, including 12,425 children, were seriously injured in a battle, a disaster or, in fact, at any one time the whole world would be horrified. Yet that is the number of persons killed and injured in Cook County last year, according to a statement just issued by the Chicago Safety Council of The Association of Commerce.

To materially reduce this number "No Accident—No Fire" week will be observed from October 8 to 14. Aside from reducing accidents every effort will be made to cut the county's annual fire loss of \$11,800,000.

Every organization—political, social, fraternal, industrial and religious—will assist in the campaign. All school children will be active in the work and the most extensive advertising campaign since the Liberty Loan drives is under way.

"The economic, as well as the humanitarian welfare of the people of Cook County demands concerted action to reduce the fire and accident risks," says Harry J. Bell, secretary of the Safety Council. "The conditions at the present time are appalling and only through the cooperation of every man, woman and child in the county can they be corrected. Seventy-five per cent of all fires and accidents are preventable and every member of the community is benefited by the prevention."

SALVATION ARMY HELPS IMMIGRANTS

Feed Newcomers Upon Arrival; \$225,000 Asked from Illinois in Drive

Every day at Ellis Island immigration station, New York, Salvation Army lassies give parties of newly arrived immigrants their first "taste" of America, in the form of the famous Salvation Army doughnut.

Sometimes a thousand dozen succulent sinkers are distributed in a single day to these prospective Americans.

"Teach them to eat a la American, and you've taken the first step toward Americanization," is the philosophy back of the doughnut distribution, as explained by Brigadier W. G. Anderson, divisional commander for Illinois.

Americanization work is included in the Salvation Army's extension program in Illinois for which \$225,000 is being asked between Oct. 22 and 31.
