CHURCH TO AID NEAR EAST RELIEF

Congregational National Council Votes Aid to Bible Land Orphans

Congregational churches throughout Illinois will contribute or pledge money for the support of helpless orphans in the Bible lands, through the Near East Relief, on Sunday, November 20, in accordance with a resolution adopted by the National Council of Congregational churches which met last July at Los Angeles. Every Congregational minister in the state has received copies of letters and cablegrams describing scenes in which children are dying on the streets of starvation in the Near East and Southern Russia.

Dr. William E. Barton, moderator of the National Council of Congregational churches, and pastor of the First Congregational Church of Oak Park, in a letter to F. J. Nichol, Executive Secretary of the Illinois Committee of the Near East Relief, said: "The National Council of Congregational Churches which met at Los Angeles in July was deeply moved by the tragedy of Armenia and joined in asking all our churches to present that cause and make generous

contributions on the Sunday preceding Thanksgiving. It will become your duty to remind the Congregational churches of Illinois of this vote. You are at liberty if you wish to say that this church, which heard the story a year ago and made a generous contribution, intends to do the same this year. It is a matter of life and death to thousands of Christ's children. It is not the will of our Heavenly Father that one of these little ones should perish."

The ministers are reminded that the present helpless condition of the women and children in the Bible lands is due to the determination of the Turks and other Moslems to exterminate Christianity from areas controlled by the Mohammedans and that without America's aid these widows and orphans of ex-service men will perish.

LAKES IN COUNTY STOCKED WITH FISH

Millions of Pike and Pickerel Are Distributed in This Region

Activities at the state fish hatchery at Spring Grove have reached a point where the establishment of one elsewhere is being considered by the Illinois fish and game department, it was learned Saturday, when Thos. S. McCafferty, superintendent of the hatchery announced that 20,000,000 pike and pickerel would be the winter's output, all of which will go into Lake county lakes, and will be ready for the Chicago and northern Illinois anglers in two or three years.

Besides the stocking of thousands of bass in the lakes of Lake county, the Spring Grove hatchery this year placed 200,000 fingerling and yearling bass all over the state, in addition to 30,000 perch and 80,000 adult blue gills.

Four million lake trout eggs from Lake Michigan are to be put into the hatchery this winter. Several new improvements are being made so that the output can be increased next year. This year was the first in four years that bass have been planted. Several lakes in McHenry were stocked this year. The following lakes in Lake county and the number of bass placed in each this year are as follows: Bangs, 3,600, Channel 4,000, Lake Zurich, 3,000, Duck 1,500, Cedar 1,000, Third 3,000, Fox 5,000, Pistakee 6,800, Loon 2,600 and Nippersink 2,800. Two thousand were placed in Fox River, near Grass Lake. Other Lake county lakes that were not stocked this year will be stocked with yearlings next season.

WAUKEGAN MAY HAVE BIG AMUSEMENT PARK

Chamber of Commerce Plans to Convert Bathing Beach into An "Atlantic City"

The Chamber of Commerce of Waukegan is enthusiastic over a new plan to convert the bathing beach in that city into a Great Lakes "Atlantic City" or Asbury Park, and at a meeting of the board of directors the plan, which had been brought to the attention by the retail section, was discussed at length. It is being considered to take over the park and beach from the city and put in all kinds of amusement concessions to provide diversion for thousands of Chicago, Milwaukee and other visitors they expect to attract.

The matter is being taken up with the steamship companies, who have expressed a willingness to inaugurate week-end excursions.

Only preliminary plans have been discussed for the entertainment of excursionists, but bathing, dancing, band and orchestra music, rest pavillions places where visitors can eat lunches they bring, or where they can purchase food and refreshments are among some of the things planned.

The city is willing to turn over the property on the beach under lease to the Chamber of Commerce, which plans to use all the profits to be derived from the enterprise in further developing it.

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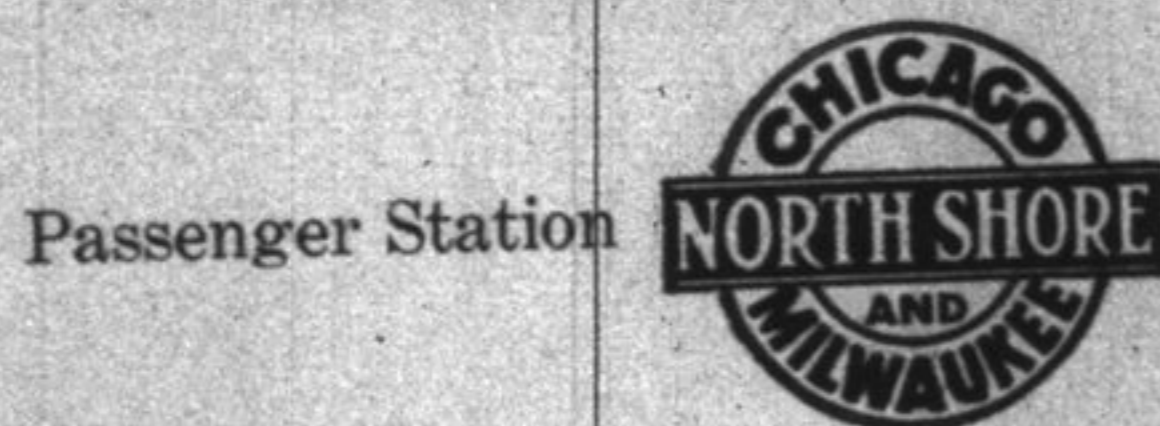
