Several Stores in Highland Park Red Cross Gives \$1,871,000 Relief When 65,000 Families Are Made Homeless

> Forty-three disasters, resulting in the death in the United States of 850 the expenditure of \$1,871,000 by the American Red Cross during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1921, says, an coming annual report of the Red Cross. These disasters caused property damage estimated at \$30,000,000, affected sixty-seven communities and rendered 65,000 families homeless.
