LUYSTER GAVE UP TO SAVE HIS WIFE
 Surrendered in Omaha When Police Threatened to Indict Her

Clayton Luyster, who occupies a cell in the Lake county jail, facing the double charge of arson and obtaining money under false pretenses, was captured in Omaha, Neb., only after his wife had been taken into custody by the authorities who threatened to have her indicted on a charge of conspiracy for failing to reveal the whereabouts of her husband who was a fugitive from justice. Mrs. Luyster managed to convey this message to her husband and he appeared at the police station and surrendered himself. This was after the authorities had made a vain effort to locate him. Mrs. Luyster has a sister and brother-in-law residing in Omaha and the local authorities believed that this would be the first place Luyster would go after jumping his \$1,500 bond in Waukegan. A detective who went to Omaha found that Luyster and his wife were living in two light housekeeping rooms. Luyster was employed on a railroad. Relatives told the detective that Luyster was twelve miles out of town and while the detectives were checking up on this false tip Luyster was communicated with by relatives and disappeared from sight. It was when he could not be located that Mrs. Luyster, together with her sister and brother-in-law were taken into custody by the police and were detained until Luyster gave himself up.

Although Luyster is said to have told the police of Omaha that he never would be brought back to Waukegan alive he has not made any attempts to take his life and is trying to figure out how he can get out of his predicament.

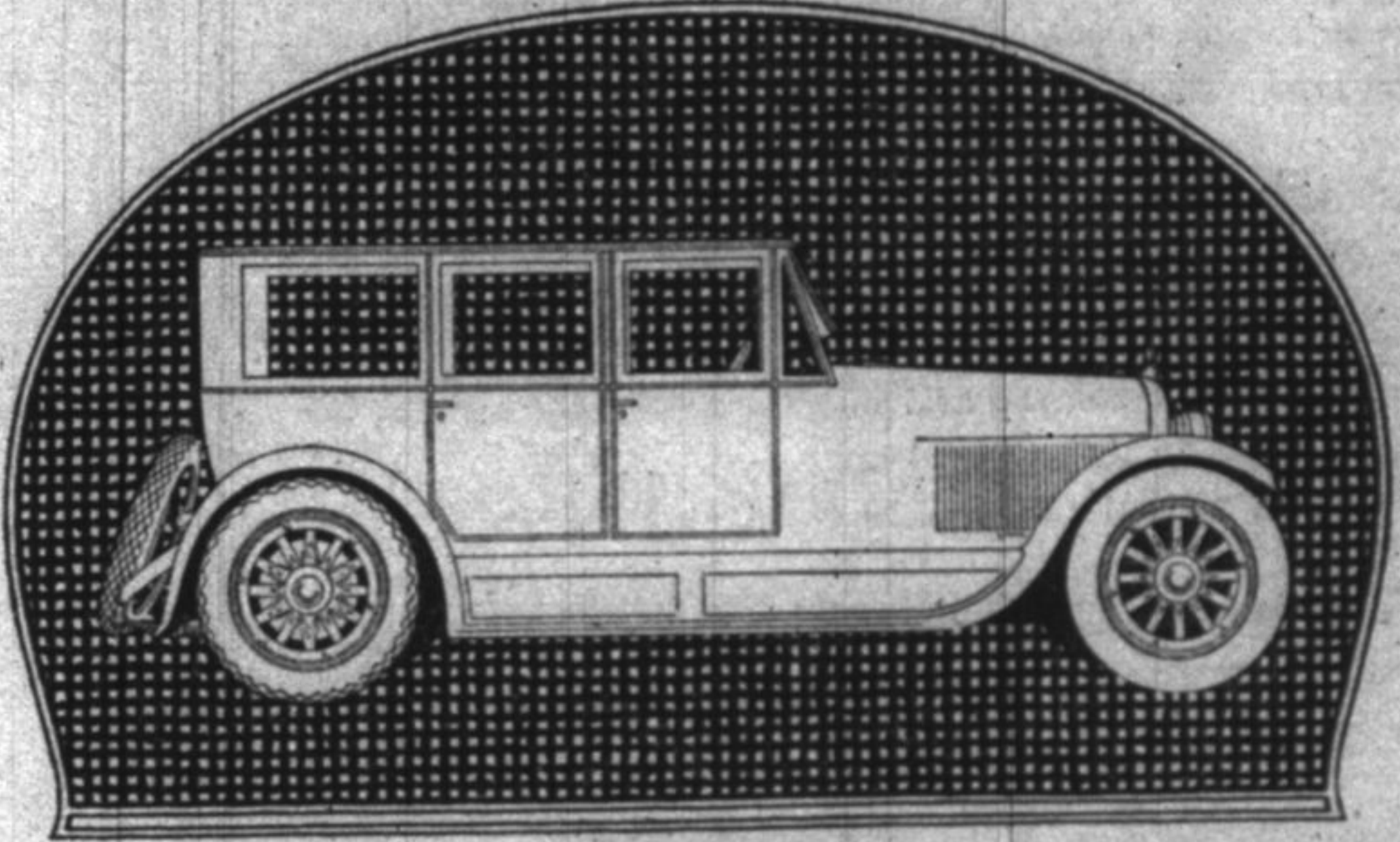
