ANOTHER STOLEN CAR FOUND AT WAUKEGAN

Checker Taxicab Had Been Stored in Barn for Several Months

The discovery by the Waukegan police of another stolen automobile which has been stored there for the last few months, is believed by the officers to be additional proof of the existence there of an automobile fence where stolen cars are taken for the purpose of disguising and then disposing of them.

The car found Saturday was stolen from the Checker taxi company of Chicago last August. Since that time it has been secreted in a barn in the rear of John Welley's home, 511 McAlister Ave., Waukegan. Kelley informed the local police that a man has been paying storage on the machine since last August.

The appearance of the car has been changed greatly. The familiar paint which has been painted black. All four tires and rims have been stripped off the car, the battery has been removed and several accessories removed.

The police have notified the Chicago department and also the taxi company and expect the owners to call for the machine. At the present time it is stored in the new police garage.

It was learned Saturday that the machine which has just been found by the Waukegan police is the eleventh machine they have recovered for the police of Chicago.

THOMPSON MAY RUN FOR CONGRESSMAN

Friends Urge Lake County Man to Enter Field; Well Known in Chicago

John R. Thompson, well known resident of Libertyville, may become a candidate for congress-at-large at the April primary. His friends are urging him to allow his name to go on the ticket.

Concerning Mr. Thompson's qualifications the Illinois State Journal of Springfield, Ill., had the following to say in a recent issue:

John R. Thompson, chain grocery and restaurant owner and farmer, is being urged by his friends to permit them to present his name at the April primary. Mr. Thompson was one of the leaders in Republican politics in Chicago ten years ago. As treasurer of Cook county he established a record for interest on public money turned into the treasury when there was no law requiring it, that attracted widespread comment. Mr. Thompson voluntarily retired from politics to devote himself to the large interests which demanded his entire attention.

He is a native of Illinois, having been born near Fithian in Vermillion county, where he grew to manhood. He still owns a farm there, which includes the old homestead, and also a farm near Libertyville in Lake county.

LARGE LABORATORIES ARE BEING BUILT

Waukegan to Have Important Chemical Plant; Will Employ Many People

When the Abbott Laboratories has completed the building units at Waukegan which it has outlined the concern will employ more than a thousand men, according to the statement made by an official last week.

The proximity of cold weather is causing the company to rush its plans with all possible speed in order that the various buildings under course of construction at Fourteenth street, may be under cover before zero weather halts work. Eighty men are at work on the job.

To indicate the speed with which the company has proceeded it was learned Friday that the work of manufacturing chemicals is progressing in two of the buildings.

The Abbott company has two five story buildings at Ravenswood at the present time and it has not been decided definitely whether or not these are to be abandoned. The buildings going up now are located on a twenty-four acre tract which permits the erection of several more units.

Unlike many laboratories the Abbott company specializes in pharmaceutical supplies. Some of the principal products are chemicals which this concern manufactured during the war when importation from Germany was stopped.

It will be one of the largest laboratories in the United States. This may take two years, it is asserted.

OLD YULETIDE CAROLS

"Holy Night" Regarded as One of Most Beautiful Songs.

"Draw Nigh, Immanuel," One of Oldest Pieces and Far Antedates Any Others.

THE ancient Christmas carol, "Holy Night" is German in its origin and is considered by many persons to be the most beautiful of all Christmas carols. It has sometimes been ascribed to Martin Luther, but the consensus of expert opinion is that it is much older than his time and is one of the oldest of German folk songs.

The carol "God Rest Ye Merry, Gentlemen," is English in its origin and dates back to about the beginning of the seventeenth century, although the author of the words and the composer of the music are unknown. The fine old melody sung to this poem possesses all the best qualifications of a sterling hymn tune and will probably last as long as the verses with which it is always associated.

The carol "Draw Nigh, Immanuel" is one of the oldest pieces of coherent music in existence, and both the words and music far antedate any of the others. The music is an old French melody, dated from the Thirteenth century, although, of course, it has been harmonized to conform with more modern standards.

There is a most curious but beautiful musical effect at the close of this carol. The words of "Draw Nigh, Immanuel," are about 100 years older than the music, being taken from the Mozarabic breviary of the Twelfth century, and it is generally believed that they were taken from the liturgy of the early Christians at Toledo, Spain, where the Mozarabic breviary was formulated.

Another carol, "The First Noel," has a traditional French melody and probably originated in Breton, although the exact origin of this fine old song is somewhat in doubt.

THE ROSE OF JERICHO

Pilgrims Told of Its Power to Bloom on Christmas Day.

Blossom Given the Name of Resurrection Flower; Also Called St. Mary's Rose.

SEVERAL varieties of the so-called resurrection plant have appeared among the novelties offered by florists, but the original is the rose of Jericho. Along the shores of the Dead sea, far enough away to be out of reach of the death-dealing vapors and the salt spray, grows the rose, a little plant famed in many a legendary story, which, when ripened, rolls up its sprays and branches into a curious little brown ball.

The desert winds snap off its dry stem and whirl the seemingly dead little ball away over sandy plains, like a feather-weight. After it chafes to reach some damp place, in about ten days, the moisture has wrought a miracle for the once dead is alive again, green and growing.

The old-time pilgrims, who brought back this plant with them from the Holy Land, told wonderful tales of its power to bloom out on Christmas day and gave it the name of resurrection flower. Another old legend names it from every spot where they halted to rest.

The dry ball when unfolding drops its seeds, and from these it may be cultivated as an annual. To resurrect these dry balls it is simply necessary to keep them standing in glasses of water, immersed about halfway to the top of their branches. The expansion is merely a mechanical spongelike process.

The botanical name of the rose of Jericho is anastasis, from anastasis, resurrection. There are other species of resurrection plants, but they are not so attractive as their Dead sea relative, which, although it has very little beauty, has an honored place among flowers because of the many fancies and associations it calls up and its peculiar development.—Argus.
