### COUNTY TREASURER MAKING OUT RECEIPTS

UTILIZES QUIET SEASON

Zion Youths Fined for Playing Football on Village Green; Other Items of County News

County Treasurer Roy W. Bracher and his aides started this week writing skeleton receipts for the taxpayers in thirteen townships in order to get a large amount of work out of the way when the rush begins, things being rather quiet in his department just now and the assistants will thus be able to divide up the work.

The skeleton receipts will give the name, address and property description. When the book is made out it will be necessary only to fill in the valuation on the property and the amount of taxes on the skeleton receipt.

Fifty-five youths were fined for playing football in a public park and three others were fined for playing Andy over and romping on the green last Friday in the court of Justice W. E. Schmalzuss in Zion.

Forty of the grid satellites received fines of \$3 and costs, it being their first offense but the other twelve were old offenders, having played two or three times, so they drew \$10 and costs. The baseball players were fined \$3 and costs.

The defendants were Independents and their attorneys, John D. Pope and Albert Hall, did not put in any evidence. The case will be appealed to the circuit court.

The selling of lentils, an ingredient of soup, as imported Japanese ferns, caused a street fakir to be chased out of town by the Waukegan police last week.

Complaint was made to the police by a member of the Waukegan Humane society. She had seen the same fake worked in Chicago and was thoroughly acquainted with it. The fakir was ordered out of town at once.

He had allowed lentil seeds to sprout and pointed them out as rare Japanese ferns. He sold the small packages of seeds for 25 cents each.

The Lake County Naval Reserve unit is being formed and Waukegan has been selected as the location of the armory.

The new organization bears the same relation to the navy department that the national guard does to the army branch. There are 200 ex-service men from all parts of the county, in the new organization, and every ex-service man in the county is eligible to membership.

Meetings will be held every Friday night. Lieut. Henning is in charge.

### LOWDEN CHAIRMAN OF NEAR EAST RELIEF

Former Governor Takes Charge in Illinois; Appeals for Help in This Work

Former Governor Frank O. Lowden, chairman of the Illinois committee of the Near East Relief has issued an appeal addressed to the people of the State of Illinois on behalf of the starving women and children of Armenia and other Bible Lands. The appeal is being sent to every county chairman in the state. The former governor accepted the chairmanship of the committee while in Chicago last week attending the stock show. He issued the appeal prior to his returning to his farm in Ogle County where he resides.

The text of Chairman Lowden's appeal follows:

"Our hearts have been repeatedly touched by the stories of distress that have come from other lands and we have responded liberally to appeals for help. No appeal that has been made has touched our hearts more than that made on behalf of the helpless women and children of Armenia and other Bible Lands.

"During the recent World War, the Armenians supported the cause of the Allies and that of the United States despite flattering offers made by the Turks and the Central Powers. For this attitude they have been subjected to cruel massacres and deportations; a large part of the population has been killed; their towns and villages have been destroyed and survivors of those massacres are now dependent upon American aid for life itself.

"In view of this situation, the people of Illinois, like the people of other states, are again being appealed to to give of their substance to sustain the lives of the helpless orphans of the Near East."

The three vice-chairmen of the Illinois committee of the Near East Relief are: Wyllys W. Baird of Chicago, Frank I. Mann of Gilman and Henry M. Pindell of Peoria, George M. Reynolds is treasurer and Frederick J. Michel is executive secretary. Committees are being organized in all the counties of Illinois.
