Our people are workers, many out of employment, none own more than their little homes, some are heavily in debt, a large per cent, are quite poor. Just now we need and must have help. There is no better field in which to plant a few dollars than right here in Highland Park. Ask any who knows Grace church, about its service and achievements, and without exception you will hear good words for Grace church.

But better than inquiry will be a visit to our Sunday school or preaching services. Come. See what we are trying to do. Or, rather, see what we are doing.
