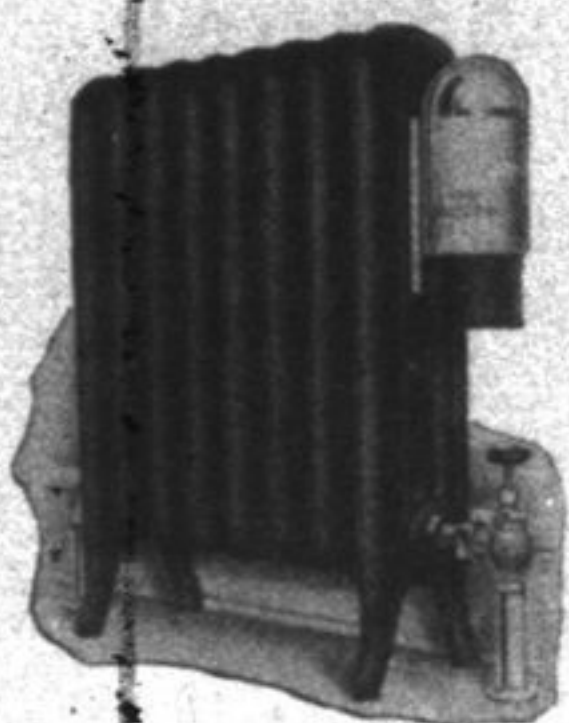

Why "Station to Station" Long-Distance Calls Cost You Less

You can save about twenty per cent on your toll bills by using our "Station to Station" long-distance service. To complete a call for a telephone number or for a listed telephone rather than for a particular person requires less time and avoids holding the line at the distant point while search is made for the person wanted.

Here are some sample forms for putting in "Station to Station" calls.

Signal the operator in the usual way and ask her for long distance. When the long-distance operator answers say:

"Give me St. Louis; Main 1234. Will talk to anyone."

"Give me Milwaukee, Wis.; Smith, Brown & Company. Will talk to anyone."

"Give me Louisville, Ky.; James Robinson's residence, 648 Mulberry St. Will talk to anyone."

In a very great majority of cases it is found that a call made in this way either reaches the particular person wanted or the person who answers can take the message or handle the business.

COUNTY CLERK GIVES DATA ON ELECTIONS

PRIMARY TUESDAY, APR. 11

Pamphlet Shows Officers to be Elected and Dates for Filing Petitions and Withdrawals

County Clerk Lew A. Hendee has issued a booklet giving complete information on all primaries and elections to be held in the state of Illinois during the year 1922. The pamphlet shows the officers to be nominated at each primary.

List of Elections

Following are the dates:
February 28—Primary for nomination of city officers who are to be elected April 4, 1922, and to nominate town officers in towns co-extensive with cities.

March 14—Primary to nominate city and village officers to be voted for on April 18, 1922.

April 4—Election of town and road district officers and of city officers in cities co-extensive with towns.

April 8—Election of trustee of schools where congressional township does not coincide with governmental town; school directors; president and members of board of education in districts of population between 1,000 and 100,000, and members of township high school board of education.

April 11—Primary for the nomination of officers to be voted for on Nov. 6, 1922, and for the election of precinct, senatorial and state committeemen.

April 15—Election of member of board of education of non-high school district and member of community high school board of education.

April 18—Election of city and village officers.

November 6—Election of state officers, of representatives in congress, of members of the general assembly and of county officers.

Officers Nominated April 11
The April 11 primary will be the most important in this district. Officers to be nominated on that date are:

State officers: (1) State treasurer; (2) superintendent of public instruction; (3) two representatives in congress at large.
District officers: (1) One representative in congress from each congressional district; (2) one senator in each odd numbered senatorial district; (3) three representatives in the general assembly in each senatorial district.

County officers: (1) County judge; (2) county clerk; (3) sheriff.

Other Information

Following are the last dates for filing and other information concerning the April 11 primary:

February 10—First day for filing petitions of candidates in the office of the secretary of state and in the office of the county clerk.

March 2—Last day for filing petitions of candidates in the office of the secretary of state and in the office of the county clerk.

March 7—Last day for candidate to file withdrawal in the office of the secretary of state.

March 9—Meeting of the senatorial committee to fix and determine the number of candidates to be nominated for representatives in the general assembly.

March 9—Last day for filing call for state and congressional conventions.

March 11—Last day for secretary of state to certify names of candidates to the county clerks.

March 14—Last day for county clerk to certify names of candidates to the board of election commissioners.

March 14—Last day for filing resolution of the senatorial committee in the office of the secretary of state and in the offices of the county clerks of the senatorial district.

March 22—Last day for candidate to file withdrawal in the office of the county clerk.

March 22—Last day for county clerk to prepare notice of primary.

March 27—Last day for posting of primary notice.

March 27—County clerk must post an announcement of the color of the ballots.

April 6—Delivery of specimen ballots of primary judges.

April 11—Primary election.

NORTH SHORE TRAINS TO RUN TO 63RD STREET

Chicago's south side merchants must wait at least another month before being linked with Milwaukee, M. J. Feron, general superintendent of transportation of the Chicago, North Shore and Milwaukee railroad, said this week.

By a recent order of the Illinois commerce commission, following a petition filed by the Woodlawn Business Men's association, the railroad was directed to run its trains to the Dorchester station in Woodlawn. The order also directed the establishment of a parcels dispatch service with a terminus at 63rd street and Calumet avenue.

"Service will be established just as soon as rates and revenues have been figured out by the traffic department," said Mr. Feron. "We plan to make stops at Roosevelt road, 43rd street and 63rd street, and schedules must be gone into. It will be at least a month before we can get started."

ANNOUNCE EXAMINATION For Postmaster

The United States Civil Service Commission, at the request of the Postmaster General, announces a competitive examination for postmaster in this city.

This examination is held under the President's Order of May 10, 1921, and not under the civil service act and rules.

Competitors will not be required to report for examination at any place but will be rated upon their education and training, business experience and fitness.

Apply to the secretary of the board of civil service examiners at the post office in this city or to the United States Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C., for application Form 2241, and Form 2213, containing definite information in regard to the examination.

Applications must be properly executed on Form 2241, and filed with the Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C., prior to the hour of closing business on the date specified in Form 2213.
