LOSE CLOSE GAMES
TO NEW TRIER, TUES.

Divide Games With Evanston.
Lights Win 20-6; Heavies
Lose 16-13

Saturday evening, the 14th, Deer-
field opened the preliminary round of
the Suburban League schedule by
dividing two games with Evanston.
The heavyweight game started fast.
The visitors got the first six points;
Deerfield rallied, but Evanston led 13
to 7 at the quarter. The second quar-
ter saw Deerfield vainly fighting to
overcome the lead. The half ended
16 to 13. Like earlier in the game,
so in the third quarter Deerfield
seemed to be having more chances for
the basket than Evanston, but she
missed the majority of them. Evan-
ston started the last period with an
advantage of 23 to 15. At this point
Evanston's fast scoring attack of
Fleetwood, Richey, and Gray came in-
to prominence. Evanston finally won
31 to 17.

This game was just another case
of victory needing more than fighting
spirit. For, if spirit would have count-
ed on the score, Deerfield would have
won decisively.

The lightweights evened matter by
easily beating Evanston 20 to 6. They
led 9 to 2 at the end of the half.
Baing's shooting from all over the
floor, Keagle's dribbles for scores,
and Martin's guarding featured.

Last Tuesday Deerfield lost two
hard games to New Trier at Indian
Hill. The lightweight game was
especially close. The first quarter en-
ded 3 all. Deerfield played fast the
second quarter; and, though having
more chances at the basket than New
Trier, led by the close score of 9 to
8 at the half. Deerfield was outplay-
ing a much heralded and undefeat-
ed team in every department of the
game. In the second half the two
teams were jockeying back and forth
with the lead. Deerfield still led 12
to 11 at the end of the third quarter.
The game ended with a 13 all tie. In
the extra period, with Laing and
Keagle out of the lineup, New Trier
sprang ahead and won 22 to 16.
"Watch those lightweights next Fri-
day."

The Deerfield heavyweights also
made a splendid showing. They held
New Trier to an 11 all score the
first quarter. In the next one New
Trier showed ahead and led at the
half 22 to 16. The last half saw
New Trier holding a safe lead of at
least three baskets and finally win-
ning 27 to 28.
