Series of Lectures at Orchestra Hall Includes Many Interesting Numbers

Burton Holmes' selection of subjects for his coming season of Photo-Stories of Travel again attests his peculiar ability for picking topics of unusual timeliness. His first subject, "Mexico," needs no comment along this line; everyone wants to know about Mexico and to see it through the eyes of such experienced cameras as those of Burton Holmes. "Japan" as the second subject is one of perennial beauty; in addition to this fact, Japan's prominence in matters concerning the present Pacific Ocean questions brings her and her people into the forefront of popular thought. The Philippines, which are also a topic of vital interest to the people of the United States, especially now that General Wood is newly appointed as their Governor-General, is to be Mr. Holmes' third subject. 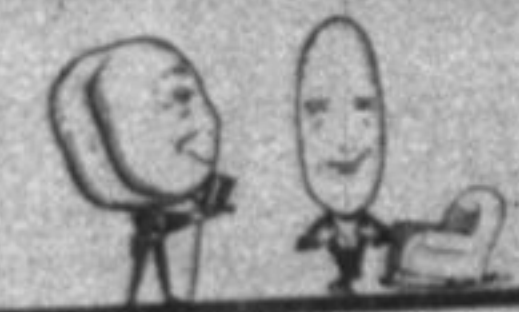

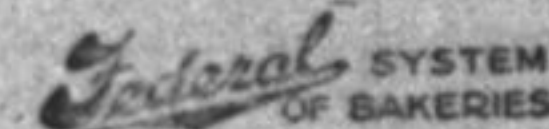
