EIGHTY-EIGHT BIDS ON HOSPITAL JOB

Victory Memorial Building at
Waukegan Will Cost Less
Than Planned

Eighty-eight bids were received by the sub-committee of the new Victory Memorial hospital, at Waukegan at a meeting last week. From the present outlook the amount the building will cost in construction will be considerably lower than the original estimate.

There were fourteen firms that bid on the general construction including roofing, painting, carpenter work masonry, tile, sheet, metal and plastering. Three concerns bid on the glass work, among the list that made bids on individual work, four on the refrigerating, two on painting, four on plumbing, twelve on heating, six on fireproofing and tile, four on plastering and lathing, seven on sheet metal, seven on marble work, two on marble and mosaic, three on screens and weatherstrips, eleven on electrical work, eight on elevators, five on iron work and four on dumb waiters.

The original estimate of the architect put the cost of the entire building around the \$300,000 mark but in the estimate made before the bids were called for there was a decided drop in the cost, the price being estimated at \$275,769.

There has been \$21,871 of work done on the building at present. This amount was deducted from the architect's estimate.

BIDS TO BE OPENED FOR 9 MILES, MAR. 31

Includes From Wheeling North
Seven Miles and 2 1/4 Miles
on Lake Villa Road

Springfield.—The state department of public works and building announced last Friday that it would open bids in this city on Friday, March 31, for the paving of section 1, route 21, of state bond issue roads, and of section 4, of the same route, both in Lake county. Section 1 will be paved for a distance of seven miles north from Wheeling and section 4 for a distance of two and one quarter miles south from Lake Villa.

At a conference earlier in the week Governor Small and officials of the State Highway Department, agreement was reached with the Lake county delegation that the State in its advertisement for work to be let on the 31st would include such bids of Bond Issue Route No. 21, (Wheeling to Antioch) for which the right of way had been obtained.

As practically all of the right of way through the Town of Vernon with one or two exceptions where absentees have promised to sign have been obtained through the unceasing efforts of Stanley T. Foote, ably assisted by Al Maether, Supervisor and Treasurer, Section 1, which runs through the town of Vernon or to a point half way between the Half Day and Libertyville, was decided upon for improvement.

It was also decided to include Section 4 from the Shilidon road to Grand avenue in Lake Villa.

George McCredie, the Highway Commissioner has been very active in securing this right of way and expects to have all of this section ready so that the highway department can be notified by the 29th that all right of way has been obtained.

Chas. E. Russell, county superintendent of highways, hopes that the right of way on Sections 2 and 3 which represents harder problems, will be included in the next letting, possibly sometime in May.

R. B. Wight of the district engineer's office was in the county seat Friday checking up on the right of way on the Wheeling road as well as the Grayslake section. If right of way had not held up part of the route the whole could have been advertised for March 31.
