### WILL CONTINUE ROAD PROGRAM IN COUNTY

County Superintendent Charles E. Russell Returns from Conference at Springfield

Charles E. Russell, county superintendent of highways and member of the committee who went to Springfield to effect a settlement of details regarding the refund of money to be used for the construction of roads in the county and for a confirmation of the road plans and estimates, returned from the capitol city the latter part of last week with the assurance that with the exception of difficulties arising over the price of cement, Lake county is ready to continue with the 1922 road program, and all details are arranged.

The widely advertised difficulty of counties in their efforts to obtain their refunds for road work seems to have disappeared, and the Lake county refund will be paid into the county treasury as fast as it is needed. The refund has been paid for the contracts already approved and let as other contracts are let the money will be received in Waukegan. There will be no delay in the Lake county road work as far as the refunded money is concerned.

The plans for the proposed road construction to be carried out this spring and summer were approved by the state superintendent and with the exception of varying prices in cement, the estimates are all approved, and the work of letting contracts will be under way within the next few days.

### INCENDIARY FIRE LEVELS SANITARIUM

Authorities Charge That Inmates at Wooster Lake Institution Fired Place

Fifty insane men and women patients cheered and capered last Friday as a fire they are accused of starting destroyed Sunnybrook Farm sanitarium at Lake Wooster, conducted by Dr. C. M. Paden. They did not succeed, although they started three different fires.

It was the building in which the first fire started that was built by the followers of the notorious Jacob Bellhart, who proclaimed themselves the Spirit Fruit society. It was at Lake Wooster the society found a refuge after being ejected first from Lisbon, Ind., and later from Chicago.

Bellhart in his most untrammelled mood, however, never conceived anything as wild and weird as the circumstance attending Friday's series of fires. The patients had concealed their plans with consummate cunning.

One of the attaches first saw the flames licking the woodwork of a second story window. She notified Dr. Paden. The fire spread so rapidly that it was beyond control before the alarm could be telephoned to Prospect and Grayslake, about ten miles away.

The nurses, guards and physicians promptly herded the patients into an attaches' dormitory a hundred yards east of the burning building. Then they tried vainly to fight the flames with buckets and chemicals. They had scarcely begun when they discovered the attaches' dormitory was ablaze. The patients were yelling madly. They had started the fire in a clothes closet. Several of them leaped through windows and attempted to flee, but were intercepted.

The nurses, guards and physicians had to abandon the fire fighting to herd them into another building—a kind of warehouse, built by the sanitarium. They had been in there but a short time when it blazed up.
