**INFORMATION FILED AGAINST OFFICERS**

**State's Attorney Smith Takes Action Against Thomas and George Gallagher of Zion**

Thomas and George Gallagher, two special police officers of Zion, are defendants in an information filed in county court at Waukegan Saturday by State's Attorney Smith in which they are charged with assault and disorderly conduct.

The filing of the information followed a beating alleged to have been received by Martin Ruesch, a Zion young man, February 5. Ruesch, according to the charges made, was out walking with Miss Margaret Fletcher of Winthrop Harbor, at the time he is alleged to have been smoking.

The special officers approached, it is said, and informed Ruesch he was under arrest. Ruesch asked if they had a warrant and then demanded, it is said, to be shown their authority to arrest him.

Whereupon, according to the charge, one of the officers drew a blackjack and beat him over the head. When Miss Fletcher sought to interfere, it is said, she received a blow in the face that knocked her down.

Ruesch was taken to the police station, where, it is charged, he was beaten again by the special officers. He was thrown into a cell and kept overnight in jail.

On the strength of this Attorney Smith a few days ago brought civil suits against the officers in circuit court. Ruesch and Miss Fletcher are suing for \$5,000. The filing of the information is a sequel to these suits.

**SCOTT TO DISCUSS MCKINLOCK MEMORIAL**

**President of Northwestern U. Will Talk at Kankakee Saturday**

President Walter Dill Scott of Northwestern University addresses alumni of that institution at Kankakee, Illinois, Saturday of this week. He will talk in a general way upon

the big plans for the enlargement and beautification of the Evanston campus and the entire upbuilding of the Alexander McKinlock Memorial campus of Northwestern University at Lake Shore Drive and Chicago avenue downtown, which was given to the University in memory of George Alexander McKinlock, Jr., of Lake Forest, who died in the service during the war. All of the four professional schools, with related buildings, are to be erected on the downtown Chicago campus and on the Evanston campus various buildings for women, including the sorority houses and a special Women's building are in contemplation. While the sororities will build their own houses, the university, it is stated, will furnish the sites and help in other ways.

On April 5th President Scott makes two speeches in the East. He is to be the guest of the Men's Temple Club of Temple Beth Zion that evening in Buffalo and will talk on the theme "Progress in Human Engineering." Enroute Dr. Scott stops at Rochester, N. Y., for a luncheon engagement and address to the Chamber of Commerce of that city. He will speak in Rochester on the same topic.

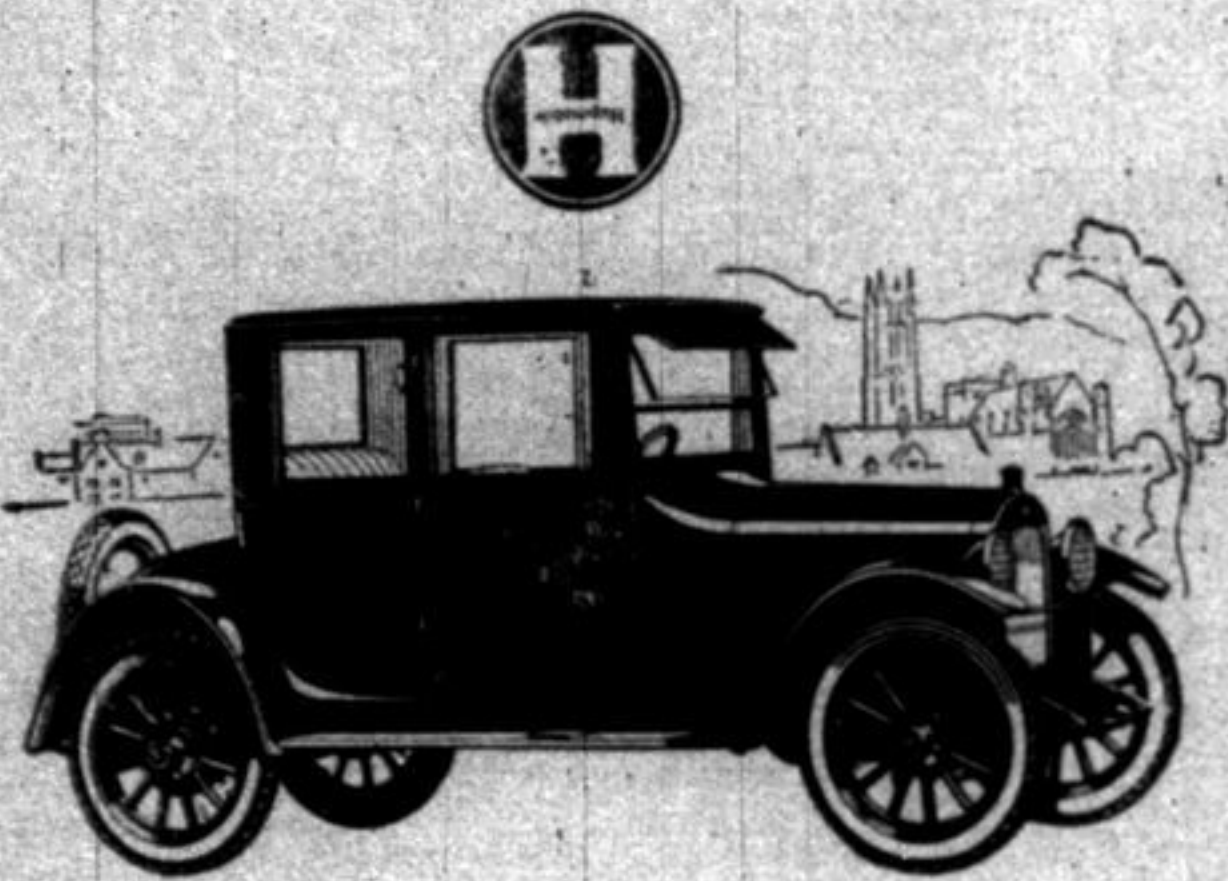

**COCOANUT LAYER CAKE**

1/4 cup shortening	1 egg	1/4 teaspoon salt
1 cup sugar	1 cup milk	3 teaspoons Dr. Price's Baking Powder
