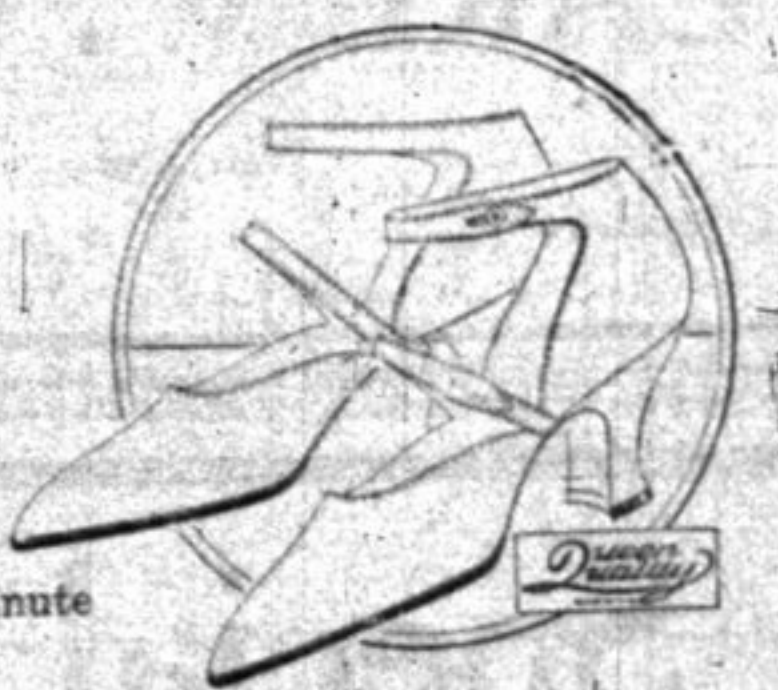

CAMP ROOSEVELT TO OPEN JULY 5

BOYS INVITED TO ATTEND REMOVE BROKEN LIMBS

Will Be Located at La Porte,
Indiana; Chicago Business
Men Back The En-
terprise

Boys from this city are again invited to take the course in physical-military training to be given during July and August at Camp Roosevelt, under command of Major F. L. Beals, U. S. A. Word to that effect has been received by authorities from Peter A. Mortenson, Superintendent of Chicago Public Schools.

During the past three summers, thousands of boys underwent training at the encampment, and it is expected this number will be greatly increased this year.

Camp Roosevelt is intended as a living memorial to the principles of military and physical fitness for which Theodore Roosevelt stood, and is established by the Chicago Board of Education, with the sanction and support of the War Department of the U. S. Government.

In order to stimulate general interest in physical and military preparedness, Camp Roosevelt is all-American, and recruits are accepted from all parts of the country. At the Executive Headquarters, Board of Education, Room 303-460 S. State street, Chicago, applications are steadily coming in from practically every state in the Union.

The camp is divided into three sections, to meet the differing needs of the boys: the R. O. T. C. division is for boys of high school age who seek primarily out-door life and physical training; the Summer School Division includes seventh and eighth grade and all high school subjects. The Chicago Board of Education authorizes the acceptance of credits earned in the camp school. The Junior Camp Division is for the younger boys, and includes instruction in scoutcraft and woodlore.

As a further cooperative step, the War Department furnishes equipment for the camp and the recruits.

This year the camp will open on July 5, and will be conducted for six weeks, divided into two periods of three weeks each. A boy may attend either one or both of these periods, as desired. The enrollment fee of \$2 will be charged, and a three weeks' outing under finest possible conditions will cost each recruit less than \$30 for the training, mess privileges, and other incidental expenses. The principal expense of the camp is borne by a group of patriotic Chicago business men who are interested in making the camp a nation-wide success.

The camp will move from Michigan to LaPorte, Indiana, 65 miles from Chicago.

REPAIR TREES HURT BY SLEET AND ICE

REMOVE BROKEN LIMBS

U. S. Department of Agriculture
Tells How to Mend Dam-
age Done in Recent
Storms

The extensive injury and destruction of trees of all kinds during the recent ice storm has brought many inquiries to the United States Department of Agriculture regarding the proper methods to be followed in repairing the damage done. The following suggestions are made by the department.

The first thing to be done is to remove such large broken branches as are now, or may become, a menace to life and property; this is usually best done by cutting at the point where broken. Attention should then be given to injuries on the main trunk. If limbs have been split, or partially split, from the main trunk, all splintered wood about the wound should be removed with a sharp gouge and mallet, if not so situated that it can be sawed off. The scar should be smoothed in the manner indicated in Farmers' Bulletin 1178, Tree Surgery, and treated as an open cavity, or as a large surface wound, as the case may necessitate.

Attention should next be given to repairing the injuries on the larger branches in a similar manner, and last of all to the smaller branches. Sometimes when a limb is broken away the tree is so weakened at the point of breakage that it may again break this the top must be pruned back more or less severely. In case of split crotches, the advice given in Farmers' Bulletin 1178 should be followed regarding the general treatment, including bolting through and above the crack.

It is fortunate that the ice storm did not come even later than it did, for decay-producing germs grow but slowly during cold weather, consequently there is a longer period in which repair work can be done before warm weather arrives. In cases of insect damage where a great amount of insecticide has been used, and only a comparatively small force is available for repairing the damage, the final cutting of long stubs can be conveniently left for a time, but wounds or breaks on the main trunk, or close to it, should be attended to promptly, in any case before warm weather arrives.

It is not necessary to fill cavities. It is better in most cases to leave them open. All final cuts should be immediately covered with some good antiseptic and waterproof paint. It will not be necessary to specially treat the ends of long stubs that are to be removed close to the trunk later in the season.

In no part of repair work should climbing spurs be used on a tree. Spur marks cause injuries through which it is possible for disease and decay germs to enter and cause damage, in some cases more severe than would have developed from the original simple break. For details of treatment of all scars and wounds send for a copy of Farmers' Bulletin 1178, which can be obtained from the Division of Publications, Department of Agriculture, Washington, D. C. Remember that prevention is better than cure. The open wound of today becomes the decayed spot of next year and the deep rotten cavity of 10 years from now. It is better to spend a few days or dollars in careful repair work now than hundreds of dollars for extensive tree surgery in 1930.
