PARK BOARD CALLS GOLF MEETING MON.

Plan to Organize Community Club. Mr. Gardner Offers Services

The Park Board has issued a call to all citizens of Highland Park interested in playing golf on the new Skokie Field course, to attend a meeting next Monday night at 7:30 o'clock at the City Hall, for the purpose of forming an auxiliary organization. It is thought that such a meeting, developing concerted team work of those interested, will greatly aid the development and maintenance of the park course by electing an executive committee and forming a club to help the board in establishing and enforcing rules and regulations.

Mr. Stuart Gardner, the well known golf professional at the Exmoor Country Club, has generously given his services in laying out the new municipal course. He has completed nine holes, and there is room for 18 in the 120 acre tract of land. When the Skokie ditch is completed, the whole area will be available. The nine holes completed will require some more work this spring, and not be open for play until about July 1. They are beautifully laid out, and the course which lies south of the junction of Deerfield and Central avenues, has aroused the interest and approval of all who have gone over it.

Everett L. Millard, acting president of the park board, is in charge of the course for the board, and an advisory committee has been helping with the work, consisting of Mr. Walter Egan, as chairman, Mr. Frederick A. Preston and Mr. Leslie McCaffrey.

Rules and regulations for the play on the course and the sale of season and day tickets to residents and non-residents will have to be established for the protection of the course, and the convenience of the people playing. It is proposed to form an auxiliary club to take these matters in hand, subject to approval by the park board, and for this purpose everyone interested is cordially invited to attend the meeting at the City Hall next Monday evening.

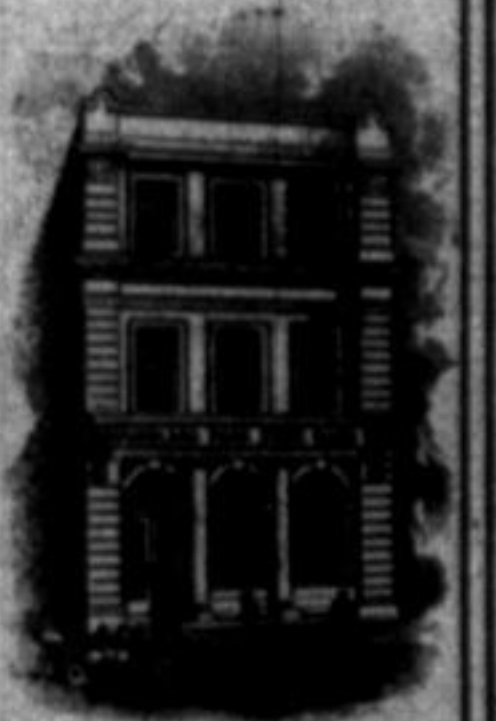
