ROUTE NO. 21 TO BE PAVED THIS SUMMER

State Highway Authorities Grant \$212,027 Contract to Chicago Company

The first of the state highway contracts in the promise of Gov. Len Small that Lake county road plans would be approved, was let to the White Construction company, 17 N. La Salle St., Chicago, by the state highway engineer at Springfield last Thursday.

The stretch to be improved is the Milwaukee road from Libertyville to Antioch. The right of way is complete on sections 1 and 4, and the contractors will start the improvement of these sections at once. The paving of sections 1 and 4 of state bond route number 21 will cost \$212,027.54, and will be opened to traffic early this fall.

Section 1 runs from Wheeling to 3 miles north of Half Day, and section 5 is Grand avenue, Lake Villa, to two and one-quarter miles south of the village.

Reason for Delay
The entire strip of highway on the Milwaukee road from the Cook county line on the south to the Wis-

consin state line on the north, would be included in the contract for the paving granted for section 1 and 4, but sections 2 and 3 are being held up through lack of property right of way. These sections should have been included in the contract given to the White company in the opening of bids on March 31, but the right of way through Libertyville and Grays Lake has not been obtained and the state will not let the work for contract until all right of way questions are settled.

Section 6, through Antioch, was obtained last week and Charles E. Russell, county superintendent of highways, believes that section 6 of route 21 will be included in the next opening of bids by the state engineering department.

Contract and bond forms were sent to the White company from the state offices at Springfield last Thursday, and the contractors will file their bond in Illinois real estate equal in value to the amount of the contract. The White people are already organizing their workers for the road job, and will move onto the job within the next few weeks. As far as possible, Lake county labor will be used in the road work and it is expected that by the time all Lake county road work is under way, several hundred men from this vicinity will be given employment.

Chicago Boys' Week, May 19 to 25.

Does Chicago want good citizens or bad ones?

If Chicago wants good citizens it must interest itself in the 250,000 coming men who are without proper supervision in their leisure hours, say the Rotarians.

To arouse Chicago to the needs of the boy the Rotary club of Chicago, with the cooperation of the boys' clubs, social settlements, and schools have organized a demonstration May 19th to 25th to be known as Boys' Week.

A great parade of 50,000 boys on Michigan Avenue will open the campaign. On the following days the subjects to be featured are athletics, church, school, health and safety, industry and thrift. The week will close with special free entertainments by the boys' clubs and settlements. Indoor and outdoor meets, talks and lectures and special school programs will carry the boys' message.

Mayor Wm. Hale Thompson is honorary chairman of the general committee and Dr. Milton H. Mack is chairman of the executive committee which is directing the campaign. Headquarters have been established in the Hotel Sherman in charge of Raoul W. Vanier, secretary, from which the activities of the various committees will be controlled.
