POSTMASTERS ATTEND MEETING AT EVANSTON

North Shore Executives Guests of Hamilton; May 1-6 "Improvement Week"

Several postmasters from Lake county attended a meeting at Evanston last week as the guests of Postmaster William J. Hamilton of that city. Postmaster Arthur C. Lueder of Chicago and a number of North Shore postmasters were present.

The post office department at Washington has set aside the week of May 1-6 as Post office Improvement Week, and Mr. Hamilton conceived the idea of inviting to a luncheon all the north shore postmasters for a conference and "get acquainted" meeting. Lake county postmasters present were: W. M. Dooley of Highland Park, Peter F. Moore of Lake Forest and Joseph L. Przyborski of North Chicago.

Talks were given by Postmaster Lueder and by Gen. Leroy T. Stewart, Supt. City Delivery of the Chicago post office.

Mr. Lueder said that every postmaster to be successful must have cooperation both on the inside and on the outside. By this he meant that the postmaster should be close enough to his department heads and where the office is small, to all employees in the service to receive from them and to give them the closest possible personal cooperation.

He expressed the belief that the right kind of publicity propaganda, which might very properly be instigated by the postmaster himself, would lead to cooperation from the public that would tend to increase the efficiency of the mail.
