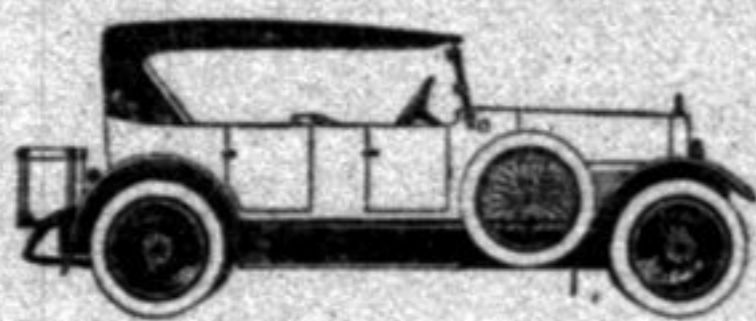

LAKE COUNTY UNION MEN IN PROCESSION

HEAR GOMPERS' ADDRESS

Building Trades Workers Parade In Chicago; Other Brief Items of Lake County News

More than four hundred members of the building trades in Lake County participated with thousands of trade unionists in a parade and demonstration as a protest against the open shop in Chicago and the Chicago district last Saturday afternoon.

The parade started from Grant Park at 2:30 o'clock. With bands in the lead the procession proceeded to the Municipal pier where a mass meeting was held. Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor, addressed the gathering there.

The twelve men held as jurors in the case against Gov. Len Small, last week failed to make an agreement on which church they would attend Sunday morning and as a result, instead of attending church, the jurors took a walk.

To make conditions as pleasant as possible for the jurors, Judge Edwards ordered that if they could agree on a church at which all would attend, the deputies would conduct them to a place of worship Sunday.

A vote on the church resulted in about twelve suggestions, and no one would change his vote. Rather than attend any service except the one they chose individually, the jurors decided that their religious exercises would be abandoned temporarily.

Richard Davis, the 10-year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Davis of the Woodin Farm in Wilson, narrowly escaped death late last Thursday afternoon when he fell from a tractor and was run over by a disc harrow.

Young Davis was riding on the tractor as farm work was being done. After making a curve with the tractor, the heavy pull caused the machine to jerk, and the boy was thrown from his seat. Before the engine could be stopped, the disc harrow passed over his body, and the only thing that saved him from death was the fact that the soft ground gave way beneath him and the farm machine passed over him.

Zionites in many instances slammed doors in the face of workers of R. S. Polk & Co., of Detroit, who are getting out a directory of Lake county, it is said.

After repeated efforts the canvassers finally were compelled to resort to other methods of getting the names of obstinate residents of Zion. They went to the office of the county clerk and copied the names and addresses on the poll books and these enabled them to check back with the names that were obtained in that city.

The work of gathering names in the county has been completed. The publishers expect to be able to distribute the directories in June.
