6,000,000 TROUT DUMPED INTO LAKE

Game Warden Kern Seeks to Replenish Fish Supply; More in the Hatchery
The trout population of Lake Michigan near the shores of this county was increased last Friday morning by 6,000,000 when Game Warden Henry Kern and Capt. Richard Smith of the Smith Fishing company dumped a whole hatching of lake trout fingerlings from the Spring Grove hatcheries.

The six million added to the lake supply only a part of the fish replenishing program carried on by the state through the game wardens in Waukegan. There are several million still in the hatcheries that will soon be ready to be planted in the lake. "They were beauties," said Capt. Smith in speaking of the fish. "I don't think any of them were less than an inch and a half long, and they were certainly a fine lot."

"The planting of fish in the lake is the only thing that will keep the lake from being fished out, and in order to do the thing right, Illinois should have more hatcheries. Wisconsin is doing a wonderful work in replenishing its streams and lakes, and fingerlings from seven hatcheries are being dumped into the waters of the state." The young fish were taken out to the proper depth in tugs of the Smith Fishing company and lowered into the water. Fishing experts are confident that the fish will live and that such planting of young fish will entirely replenish the waters of Lake Michigan which has showed a decided scarcity of fish within the last few years.

Special Program to be Observed During Week. Register All Children at City Hall

The coming week, May 7-13 has been proclaimed by the Governor as Health Promotion Week.

This is the fourth annual observance and all citizens are urged to take part in it.

The outline of the program as set forth by the State Department of Public Health is as follows:
Sunday, May 7th
Health sermons and talks by clergymen and Sunday school teachers.

Monday, May 8th
Birth Registration Campaign
All parents of children born since Jan. 1, 1922 are urged to send a postcard to the Department of Health, City Hall, giving the name and address of the child.

Registration of birth is of vital importance to each child; by registration the child is given legal existence and all parents should see to it that their children have not been neglected.

Tuesday, May 9th
Completion of Birth Registration.
Wednesday, May 10th
Baby conference at City Hall. Talk on care of babies. Foods, Milk, Pasteurization, etc., at 4 p. m.

Thursday, May 11th
Vaccination Day.
All unvaccinated persons are urged to be vaccinated against smallpox on this day.

Friday, May 12th
1. Health day in schools. One study period in each school should be devoted to health lessons.
2. Annual physical examination of adults.

All persons are urged to see their family physicians for a thorough medical examination.

Saturday, May 13th
Clean-up and Paint-up Day.
Clean-up and paint-up houses and surrounding premises.

BOARD OF HEALTH GOURLEY TO CONDUCT ART SCHOOL HERE

Children Will be Instructed in Drawing, Sketching and Painting

Highland Park young people will have an opportunity to study art at home this summer. Edward Drew Gourley, 379 E. Elm place, will conduct classes in art at the Elm Place school. A limited number of children, approximately between the ages of ten and sixteen, are eligible for registration. They must be registered on or before June 1.

Mr. Gourley will instruct his pupils in interior and out-of-door sketching, drawing and redimentary painting. For diversion the young people will go on various excursions and hikes.

Highland Park, Mr. Gourley believes, is a very suitable location for an art school. Under his plan the instruction which, in the past, local people have had to seek elsewhere, will be given at home. Art work is beneficial to children in many ways. It is educational in botany, zoology and physics, as well as in the actual painting.
