#### FIRST COMMERCIAL RADIO STATION

A wireless telephone broadcasting station is being constructed by the American Telephone and Telegraph Company on the roof of one of its skyscrapers in New York.

This station is unique because it will be the first radio station for telephone broadcasting operated on a commercial basis. It will furnish a means of distributing news, music or other program to anyone who desires to contract for the broadcasting of such service.

This station will be equipped with the latest developments of the Bell system, including the use of electrical filters and new methods whereby, as the business grows, several wave lengths can be sent out simultaneously from the same point, so that the receiving stations may listen at will at any one of the several services.

The Bell Company will not provide a program of its own, but will furnish the facilities for broadcasting in response to many requests from newspapers, entertainment agencies, department stores, a great variety of business houses and others who wish to utilize this means of distribution.

The new station is designed to cover a region from 100 to 150 miles surrounding New York. However, under most favorable conditions it might be heard for much greater distances. The service of course will be free to anyone with a receiving set.
