Nature had on her "Bridal Gown" during the past week, never before during the past twenty-five years have the Native Plums, the Cherries, the Apples and the Pears presented a more glorious sight — loaded down with blossoms — it is almost too near home to fully appreciate all this.

Two hundred eight-year-old Jonathan Apple Trees netted the owner ten dollars per tree and that happened just a little north of Waukegan last Fall, and we just completed planting an Apple Orchard of six hundred trees in Deerfield. The Trees are going to grow and bear and so will yours.

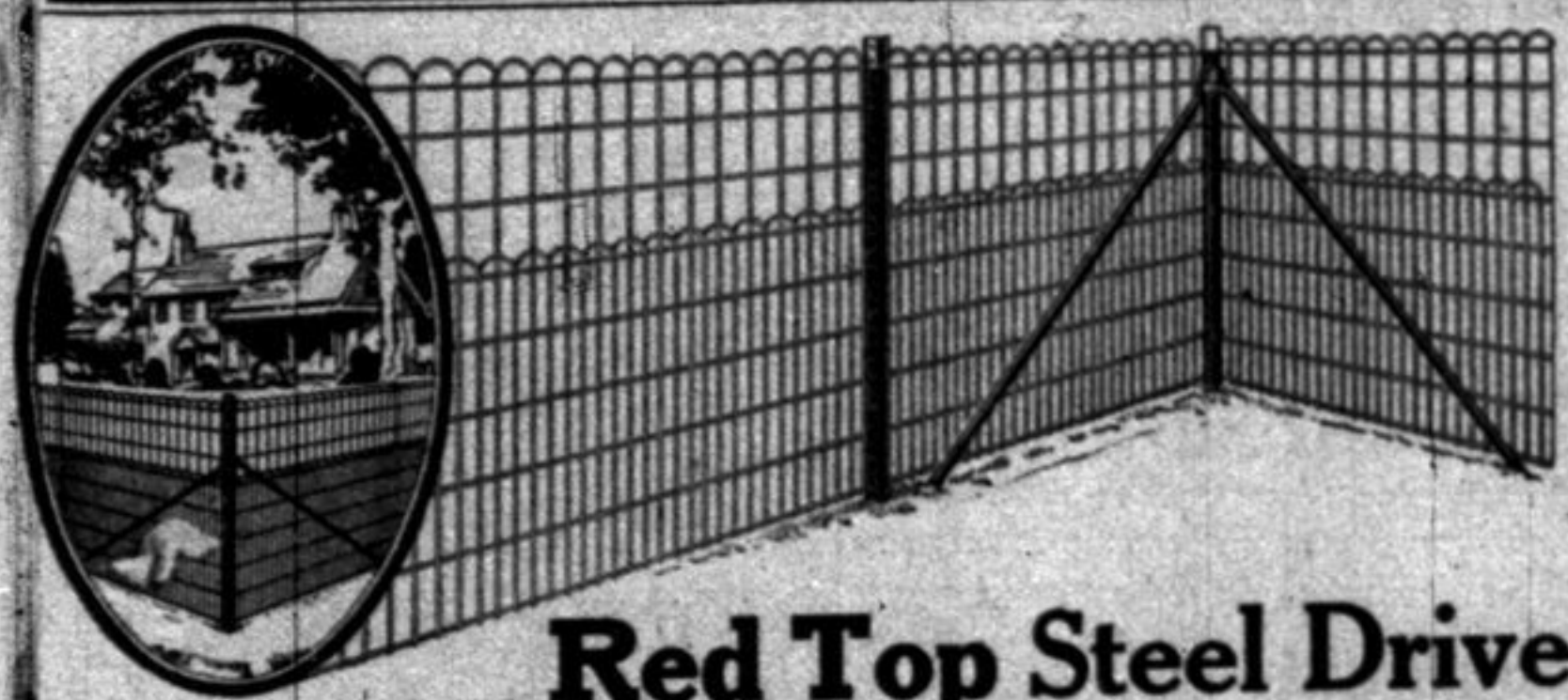
