YOUTH INJURED IN AUTO CRASH DIES

Earl Snyder, Libertyville Boy, Fatally Injured When Train Hits Automobile

Earl Snyder, 15 years old, son of Mr. and Mrs. Delbert Snyder, Libertyville, and freshman at the Libertyville high school, died at 5 o'clock last Saturday morning in the Victory Memorial hospital of injuries received Monday afternoon of last week, when the automobile in which he was riding was struck by an electric line car at Howell's crossing, Libertyville.

The boy was a freshman in the Libertyville high school to which he came at the beginning of the school year from the Libertyville grammar school. With Luella Hook, Leone Wightman and Vincent Casey, owner of the automobile, he was riding about between the time school was dismissed Monday afternoon and the hour set for them to appear for practice in an operetta. All were in the car except Casey who was standing on one of the running boards.

Miss Hook Driving Miss Hook, learning to drive an automobile, was at the wheel as the

car approached the railroad tracks. When some distance from the tracks she applied the emergency brake but it failed to work. The car coasted down a slight slope to the tracks and stopped dead in the path of the train. The train crashed into the helpless auto scattering its occupants in all directions. The electric car which, according to witnesses, clanged its gong while approaching the crossing, continued a considerable distance before it could be halted. Besides Miss Hook and young Snyder there was in the ill fated car Leone Wightman, who suffered injuries and was taken home. Ambulances, rushed to the scene, took the boy and girl to the Waukegan hospital.
