DEPUTY SHERIFF IS HURT IN ACCIDENT

COLLISION AT WAUKEGAN

Wauconda Women Also Injured
In Smashup; Other Brief
Items of Lake Coun-
ty Happenings

Homer Cook, deputy sheriff, and Miss Myrtle Kuebker, both of Wauconda, Ill., were injured last Saturday morning when the car in which they were riding was struck by an Essex automobile at West Washington street and Green Bay road, Waukegan.

Miss Kuebker, suffering from injuries to her hip was taken to the Victory Memorial hospital. Cook went home after receiving treatment.

The \$285,000 estate of the late William Van Bergen Ames of Libertyville is disposed of in a will that has been filed for probate in county court at Waukegan. The Merchants Loan and Trust company of Chicago are named executors of the estate. Mr. Ames died at Phoenix, Ariz., on Feb. 23, of this year. His estate consisted of \$135,000 in real estate and \$150,000 in personal property.

Owing to the illness of Judge P. L. Persons, the cases called in the juvenile court last Saturday were continued until next Saturday when it is expected that Judge Persons will have recovered sufficiently to go on with his court work.

Hon. Darius A. Brown, supreme dictator of the Loyal Order of Moose, fired the opening gun in a membership campaign in North Chicago and Waukegan, when he delivered a stirring address last Friday night at Slovenic hall on "The Moose, what they are doing, and the purpose of their institution at Mooseheart." Saturday night he lectured at the Armory.

After Mr. Brown's speeches, Waukegan lodge will seek to increase its membership by 500. Teams have been organized and will begin a systematic canvass of the city.

Frank Pallela, a worker employed by Harris Brothers in wrecking Camp Dewey at the Great Lakes Naval Training station was injured last Friday afternoon when he fell from the roof of one of the buildings to the ground twenty feet below. He suffered a fracture of two ribs and bruises on the body. He was taken to the Victory Memorial hospital.

Talbot Patrick, of Chicago, reporter for the Chicago Evening Post, was shot in the shoulder early Friday morning while riding with three other newspaper men and Duke Nolan, restaurant owner of Waukegan, between Wheeling and Evanston. The automobile carrying the five men and driven by Mr. Nolan was proceeding in Telegraph road near Evanston when six county policemen clad in their khaki uniforms and riding in another automobile drove up, it is said.

According to reports, the men in Nolan's car believed that the policemen were holdup men and called for more speed. As the car broke away one of the policeman fired a shot which grazed Patrick's shoulder. The wound was slight but the reporter was taken to the Evanston hospital for treatment. The automobile was stopped immediately and the other occupants of the car helped the policemen take the wounded man to the hospital.
