Hardware Foundry company disposed of factory No. 5, located adjacent to the Cyclone Fence company, at North Chicago, to the Bifex Products company for a consideration of \$50,000. The Bifex company, according to the announcement, will utilize the new plant for expansion purposes in the manufacture of the famous Bifex bumpers.

The "unwritten law" last Saturday had failed to gain freedom for Dave Soderman, of Waukegan, who shot and killed J. Clay Powers, playwright and prominent Kentuckian, in a hotel at Ballas, Tex., a month ago. A jury in Judge C. A. Pippin's court shortly before midnight returned a verdict of guilty of manslaughter and fixed the penalty at 5 years in the state penitentiary. Blinding headlights and spotlights are banned in Waukegan and each violation of this law will be met with fitting punishment, Chief of Police Thomas Tyrell announced Saturday morning.

As soon as the right of ways for the roads are secured, bids will be advertised for and the contracts will be let. No further delay is expected, and unless a rainy season later in the summer delays the work on the road, the work planned for this season will be completed, and Lake county will take its place among the counties of the state with a good system of hard state-aid highways.
