## SENIOR CLASS PLAY PROVES GREAT SUCCESS

"The Rivals" Given at Ravinia Park Theatre; Much Talent is Shown

"The Rivals" as presented by the class of 1922, at the Ravinia Park theatre last Saturday night, was an unquestioned success. From start to finish it kept the audience in a gale of laughter. Its interpretation was in many ways a departure from the orthodox version of this play, but it was just so much the more delightful for these innovations. The characters were well chosen and well executed. Lucille Spellman made a very charming and appealing Lydia Languish and was well supported by Elizabeth Morrison, who took the part of Julia Melville, Lydia's confident, and did it with rare charm and simplicity. Captain Absolute, taken by Paul Gorbey, was exceedingly well done as well as Faulkland, Julia's fiance, by Edward Grant. Both showed to advantage in the parts of the elegant and polished gentlemen of the 17th century. Milton Swanton's character portrayal of Sir Anthony Absolute was unusually fine. Margaret Cliggett's Mrs. Malaprop did that lady full justice in every detail and furnished no mean share of the evening's amusement.

Every time that Graham Keagle and Garfield Proctor so much as set foot on the stage they brought down the house; Keagle in the part of Bob Acres and Proctor as Sir Lucius O'Trigger, an Irish Baronet, possessed of all the required Irish wit, red hair and brogue. One of the sprightliest scenes in the whole play was the street scene between Sir Lucius and Lucy, Lydia's maid. Carlene Ehle made a truly fascinating and naive Lucy. She did it with the naturalness of a professional. Another well-drawn character was Fag, a servant of Captain Absolute. It was admirably taken by James

Russell. In the same class of excellence came David, Bob Acres's servant, taken by Beulah Stafford. Earl Frisbie made a very realistic coachman and Alverdash Helming and Peter Kelly as maid and servant did their parts "par excellence".

The scenes were various and included: a street in Bath, Mrs. Malaprop's lodgings, Captain Absolute's lodgings, Julia's dressing room, Acres's lodgings and Mead Fields. The settings were extremely well done and reflected a great deal of credit on Harold Jaeger, property manager and stage director. The period costumes were a great addition both as to beauty and atmosphere. Blanche Schuler as costume manager did her part well.

The music was furnished by the High School orchestra under the direction of Mr. Herbert S. Conover. It gave some very interesting numbers.

To sum up the whole affair, it was a huge success, due not alone to the excellency of the players, themselves, but to Robert Wolf, Business manager, Mr. Hinsdale and to the persistent and untiring effort of Miss Hathaway the coach.
