#### COMMENCEMENT WAS SPICY AT COLLEGE

#### Senior Class Repudiates Action of Its President; Endorses the Administration

Seniors at Lake Forest college, indignant at the scurrilous attacks made upon President H. M. Moore and the administration of the college, passed a resolution repudiating the statements made by Henry Kunz, president of the graduating class. The action was taken just before the class proceeded into the Reid chapel to receive the diplomas.

A letter circulated among the alumni of the college the previous night, and signed by Kunz, assailed the president bitterly. Kunz' classmates declared that the letter was the result of personal prejudice, and did not reflect the true feeling of the student body.

Rev. Newell Dwight Hillis, a Lake Forest alumnus, delivered the commencement address at the college. He spoke of the great need for education among the people of the United States, and used the 1920 census report as the basis of his talk. Dr. Hillis declared that this country expends annually pro rata a great deal more money for state institutions for the unfortunates than does any other country.

After the commencement exercises, at which twenty-one seniors received their degrees, the commencement luncheon was held in the Calvin Durand Commons.

#### DEERFIELD FORFEITS 1922 LEAGUE TITLE

#### Two Players Admit They Broke Rules; Oak Park Game Is Surrendered

Deerfield high school Monday forfeited its game with Oak Park and by so doing surrendered the Suburban league baseball championship to the Orange and Blue faction. The reason for this unexpected occurrence was attributed to the fact that two players on the Deerfield nine voluntarily confessed to playing Sunday ball with the Highland Park Young Men's club, which was an infraction of the league rules and made them ineligible for high school competition.

Oak Park had not protested the youthful stars and had no idea that the two boys were ineligible to compete in the championship game today. Upon hearing the confessions Coach J. L. Rothacher immediately phoned the news to Coach Glen Thistlewaite, mentor of the Oak Park school. Coach Thistlewaite regretted the incident and offered to play the Deerfield team in spite of the ineligibility of the two players, stating that he did not wish to win the championship from such a clever ball team without earning it in the customary fashion, but Deerfield declined, as it did not wish to make any exception to the league rule.

Coach Rothacher also notified Bloom high, the south section champion, which was defeated by Deerfield last week, and offered to forfeit the victory, but Coach E. G. Lean of that school admitted that one of his players had also engaged in Sunday ball this year and the entire game was automatically thrown out by Dr. W. J. Monilaw of the University high, president of the Suburban league.
