BEACH WATER IS UNSAFE — WARNING

along the shore from Broadway to Ravine drive. The laboratory reports show all to be swarming with bacteria, with high proportion of cholerae, indicating contamination, and all were reported "unsuitable for bathing," except the specimen from Park District Beach North which was considered "Doubtful." Further tests are being made to see if these conditions are constant.

Water such as this may cause infections of nose, sinuses, eyes, and ears, and if swallowed, intestinal troubles. We had many such cases last summer. No case of typhoid has as yet occurred, but there is always the possibility.

We have conferred with the chief of the Bureau of Small Parks and Public Beaches in Chicago, where there is the same problem. Various remedies suggested were considered at a conference on June 18, but none was found practicable. Chlorination which makes the lake water safe for drinking cannot be used in the open lake to purify the water for bathing.

Therefore, under the present conditions, the public is warned that bathing along the lake shore is dangerous to health.

The family bath tub is perfectly safe for the water from the city mains has been chlorinated.

The septic tanks of the city are now under the control of the North Shore Sanitary District, by whom made and carried out for the sanitation of the North Shore.

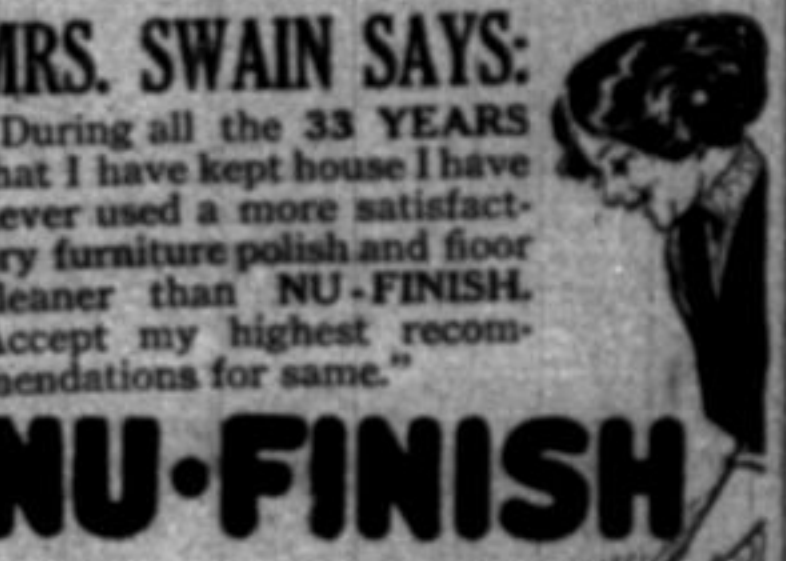
An inspection of the septic tanks made this week shows all to be in excellent working condition.
