INDICTMENTS RETURNED AGAINST MAX MAXIM

Former Proprietor of Roadhouse Charged with Violation of Mann Act

Two indictments were returned last Friday by the federal grand jury in Chicago, charging Max Greineder, better known here as Max Maxim, former owner of the Chateau Maxim, with violations of the Mann act and smuggling diamonds into the United States.

According to testimony given the grand jury, Greineder brought Anna Herzog, an 18 year old Viennese girl, to the United States and then transported her to Chicago.

At the instigation of Greineder the girl is said to have brought \$30,000 worth of jewels with her and evaded paying duty by stating that she was merely visiting this country. She is being held as a government witness.

While the proprietor of the Chateau Maxim, a well known road house, Maxim, or Greineder, was arrested by the Lake county authorities and was tried in court at Waukegan. He was found guilty by a jury and was sentenced to pay a fine of \$900 and serve 240 days in the county jail. The case was appealed, and while it was pending local authorities consented to disregard the jail sentence if Greineder would pay the fine. This he did and disappeared, leaving for Europe. Shortly after his departure the appellate court affirmed the judgment of the local court.

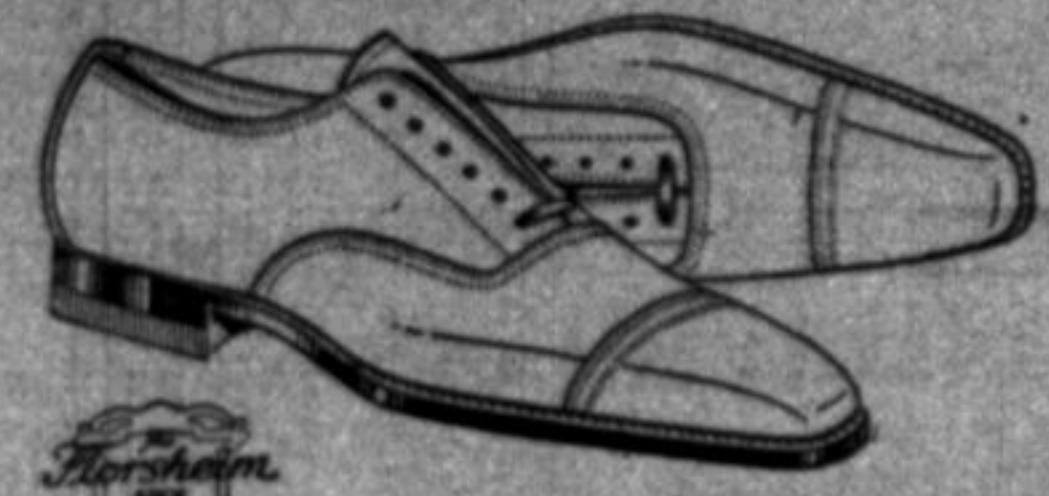
