Williams and Brown played a deep court game. Brown, who is an aggressive net game player, was forced to abandon this style because of the heavy condition of the court, due to a rainstorm which caused postponement of the match a half hour. The Yale man was much the staidier. In the frequent long rallies Williams drew Brown out of position and caused him to commit a number of errors. Virtually every point came only after a long rally. Brown made a hard fight to stave off defeat in the third set. With Williams leading, 4-1, Brown dropped the back court style of play, and by rushing to the net at opportune times won the next four games. Williams, however, rallied and won the final three games. Lucien Williams is the son of Mr. and Mrs. L. M. Williams of S. Green Bay road of this city. He was Yale's tennis star and he has played a prominent part in many matches.
