BE IT ENACTED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT:

Section 1. No person shall make, aid, countenance or assist in making any improper noise, riot, disturbance, breach of the peace or diversion tending to a breach of the peace, within any of the parks or boulevards or other public places within the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, or be guilty of any disorderly conduct therein, or collect, with other persons, in bodies or groups for unlawful purposes, or for any purpose to the annoyance or disturbance of citizens or travelers, under the penalty of not less than Ten Dollars nor exceeding Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

Section 2. No person shall disturb the peace and quiet of any park or boulevard or other public place under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, by loud or unusual noises, or by tumultuous or offensive carriage, threatening, trading, quarreling, challenging to fight or fighting, or any person shall carry concealed weapons, or in a threatening manner display any pistol, knife, slung-shot, brass, steel or iron knuckles or other deadly weapons, under the penalty of not less than Ten Dollars nor exceeding Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

Section 3. No person, not legally authorized to bear weapons in the discharge of his duty, shall discharge any fire-arm in or upon any of the parks or boulevards or other public places under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, and any such person so offending shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined in any sum not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Two Hundred Dollars for each and every such offense.

Section 4. No person shall appear in any public place, under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, in a state of nudity or in a dress not properly belonging to his or her sex, or in an indecent or lewd dress, and no person shall make any indecent exposure of his or her person, or be guilty of any lewd or indecent act or behavior, under the penalty of not less than Ten Dollars nor exceeding Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

Section 5. No person shall commit any indecent, lewd or filthy act in any place, or shall utter any lewd or filthy words or use any obscene, threatening or abusive language in the hearing of other persons publicly, within any of the parks or boulevards or other public places under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, and any person so offending shall be subject to the penalty of not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

Section 6. No person shall kill or wound, or attempt to kill or wound, by the use of firearms, bow and arrow, pelting with stones, or otherwise, any bird or animal within any of the parks or boulevards or other public places under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, or shoot an arrow, or throw a stone, or club, or other missile, at any bird or animal within any private ground near or abutting upon any of the parks or boulevards or other public places under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, under the penalty of not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Two Hundred Dollars for each offense.

Section 7. No person or persons shall distribute, cast, throw or place in, upon or along any of the boulevards, parkways, streets, parks or other public places under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, any handbills, pamphlets, circulars or other advertisements for any purpose whatever, under a penalty of not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Two Hundred Dollars for each offense.

Section 8. No person shall bring within, give away or drink any intoxicating liquor upon any of the boulevards, parkways, streets, parks or other public places under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, under a penalty of not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

Section 9. Vagrants, mendicants, idle and dissolute persons, who go about begging, or place themselves in any highway to beg or receive alms, persons who use any juggling or unlawful games, common drunkards, prostitutes, lewd, wanton and lascivious persons in speech or behavior shall not be allowed within any of the parks or boulevards or other public places under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, and any such person or persons so offending shall be fined not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

Section 10. No person shall play at any game whatsoever in or upon any of the parks, boulevards, streets or driveways, under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, except upon such portions thereof as may be designated from time to time by the said Commissioners, and under such rules and regulations as may be prescribed by them, and any person violating this section shall be subject to a fine of not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

Section 11. No person shall expose any article or thing for sale, or do any hawking or peddling, in or upon any of the parks, boulevards, streets or driveways, under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District without permit from said Commissioners, under the penalty of not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

Section 12. No person shall use abusive, insulting or obscene language, or language calculated to occasion a breach of the peace, nor shall any person tell fortunes, play at any games of chance, be drunk or do any indecent acts in or upon any of the parks, boulevards, streets or driveways under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, under the penalty of not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars

for each and every offense.
Section 13. No person shall commit an assault, or an assault and battery, within any of the parks, boulevards or other public places under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, and any person who shall be convicted of either shall be fined not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

Section 14. No person, without permit from the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, shall sleep within any of the parks, boulevards, or other public places under the control of said Commissioners, between the hours of eleven o'clock p. m. and six o'clock a. m., under penalty of not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each and every offense.

Section 15. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication, as provided by law.

NORTH SHORE CEMETERY MAKING RAPID PROGRESS

Evidence is accumulating that NORTH SHORE CEMETERY has become a real institution well established in the life of the people of the North Shore area. A large and ever increasing number of readers of this paper are interested in this modern place of interment, and hence a statement of progress will be made from time to time.

In the statement issued by John Western, President of Modern Cemetery and Mausoleum Company, the corporation which is conducting NORTH SHORE CEMETERY, it appears that very important progress has been made during the first half of the present year. The winter weather was favorable for hauling several carloads of mulching material to use in promoting the growth of the trees and shrubs, also many cars of crushed stone which has been used to make a water-bound macadam of the main driveway.

Visitors during various periods of the spring and summer have been enthusiastic in praising the exceptional display of Forsythia blooms which came first in the spring, the large and rare showing of six or seven varieties of lilacs which followed the Forsythias, and afterward the various varieties of Spiraea and many other blooming shrubs. At present many varieties of roses command the admiration of all visitors. NORTH SHORE CEMETERY has what is probably the most charming trellis of Dorothy Perkins pink roses in the entire state. During the last few days every visitor to the cemetery has stood about this thing of charm and beauty for several minutes. The little lake presents three varieties of aristocratic pond lilies, as well as Mallard ducks, swans and schools of gold fish. Another feature which all lovers of beauty talk about is the pleasing effect created by many groups of trees and shrubs of strikingly colored foliage, several groups of purple-leaved plums and the luxurious showing of Golden Elders.

In the month of May visitors purchased lots amounting to \$7,093 and during June the amount reached \$7,352. One man came from Glencoe in May and purchased a choice spot

for a mausoleum site for \$2,700. For two years every town along the shore from Chicago to Zion City has been represented on the list of lot owners and in the list of interments. This year several citizens of Libertyville, Deerfield and other interior towns have visited this landscape garden, expressed their admiration and purchased lots.
