**CHILD KILLED WHEN CAR HITS PONY CART**  
**SEVERAL OTHERS INJURED**

Great Lakes Post Office Doomed, Says Report; Other Items of Lake County News

Marie Nohlecek, aged 6, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Nohlecek, 109 North Utica street, Waukegan, met instant death, and three of her companions escaped almost by a miracle when a pony cart in which they were riding was struck by the west-bound street car on Washington street just west of West street last Wednesday night about 6:20 o'clock.

Francis Foley, 12-year-old son of Dr. and Mrs. J. C. Foley, owner of the pony and cart, escaped with badly bruised elbows. Doris Welch, aged 9, and Russell Welch, aged 3, children of Mr. and Mrs. Clayton Welch of 313 Water street, were thrown out of the cart but fell clear of the street car wheels.

Joseph Elon, 30, of 3032 Allen avenue, Chicago, was killed instantly, and three others received more or less serious injuries when a touring car in which they were riding was struck by a double-header Elgin, Joliet & Eastern railroad freight train at Hollister road crossing, Barrington, at 5:45 last Friday night.

One of the injured, Mrs. T. Krantz, North Ashland avenue, Chicago, mother-in-law of the dead man, was hurt the most serious. She suffered two broken ribs and possible internal injuries. She was rushed to a Chicago hospital.

Frank Snella, 3005 Gresham avenue, Chicago, a sheet-metal contractor, owner and driver of the automobile, suffered a wrenched back and severe bruises.

Steve Lasecka, Melrose avenue, Chicago, the fourth member of the party, succeeded in leaping from the machine a second before the crash took place. He received a painful bruise.

Fourteen business men of Zion City were fined \$25 and costs each in Zion last Thursday for failure to pay the license fee prescribed for them by a recently passed revenue-producing ordinance. Without exception the cases have been appealed to the higher court.

Plans to raise \$40,000 to purchase a site for the Jewish boys' camp at Long Lake, near Fox Lake, were completed last Friday in Chicago at a luncheon of the Young Men's Jewish Charities association at the Morrison hotel. The drive will be conducted by members of the organization among the wealthy Jews of Chicago, according to B. F. Stein, secretary. Long Lake camp receives boys from 10 to 16 years old each summer, holding five camp periods of two weeks each.

The first annual "North Chicago Day" was planned last Friday at the meeting of the North Chicago Commercial association. Arrangements were made at this discussion to close all factories, stores and other shops in the town on August 12th for a big "Know Your Neighbor and Boost North Chicago" celebration to be held in Foss Park.

Waukegan faces a coal shortage that is more serious than any within the memory of any of the local dealers or heavy users of coal. The shortage during the war will be insignificant in comparison to the one that threatens Waukegan today, so they all declare.

But a thirty-day supply of coal is at the North Shore Gas company plants, according to J. G. Hart, Manager, and plans are under way to take care of the emergency that is expected.

So acute is the situation, he declares that the small quantity of coke that they have on hand is being held for plant consumption to make "water gas" when the gas coal supply is gone.
