### "CHICK" EVANS, JR. PRAISES BRIERGATE

#### NEW COURSE IS FAMOUS

Calls It One of the World's Greatest Courses in Chicago Daily News Story Monday

#### The Perfect Course

Chicago has become the world's greatest golfing district. Within a radius of forty miles in three directions from the city hall are more fine golf courses, numbering more enthusiasts for the sport, than can be counted in any similar area in the world. Added to this great spread of golf favor here, comes now an achievement which is attracting to Chicago the attention of the golfing world. This interest centers on a new type of golf course, recently completed in the Chicago district, which embodies such principles of links design and general club plan that Chicago, because of this outstanding course may light the way to revolutionary developments in this sport, or, rather, in the fields on which it is played. It no doubt will be something of a surprise to Chicago golfers to learn that in this supreme golfing district has been developed, by the world's foremost golf architects, one of the world's greatest golf courses, judged by today standards. This course is the Briergate links, near Highland Park. Briergate has a brief history but it has a future that may be epochal.

#### Briergate Already Famous

Briergate, a year old, is already famous among those of the sport who have an ear to the ground, so to speak, for gauging the tendencies of the game is likely to develop. Golf in this country must inevitably break away from the traditions that have ruled the sport for centuries—and Briergate stands as the first course to do it. Golf in this country has been influenced by the hundreds of years of golf in Europe. In this club we have the first complete development of American golf, with a course modeled strictly to the needs of golf as it is played in America today.

One of the remarkable factors of this is that in this Chicago club we have, for the first time, a course planned and built strictly to the requirements of golf played with the modern, fast ball. Other courses have been remodeled here and there, of necessity, as the resiliency (and therefore the flight) of the golf ball has been increased and as clubs have been made more effective. But in Briergate we have a course fashioned by Capt. Alison, of a famous firm of English golf architects to stand as the world's model for golf in the future.

Every long hole at Briergate is exactly what a long hole should be, in the judgment of Capt. Alison. Every hole is different. The "personality" of the course goes beyond anything the British builder ever was able to obtain previously. The architect was under no necessity of sacrificing at Briergate as he had 161 acres of ground on which to apply his ideas for "the perfect, modern links." Not one fairway crosses another. None of the traps is placed in the conventional manner. Thus, the trap, instead of being about what you expect it to be, is always something you don't expect to meet. This does not throw you off your game because the builder, wisely, went just far enough in these details. The result is a course alluringly interesting wherever you chance to be upon it. It intensifies the sport.

#### Short Holes a Revelation

The short holes are a revelation. On many courses the green may be reached on short holes even though the tee shot be fozzled. Not so here. The short holes at Briergate immediately become long holes if the tee shot is not properly executed. This constitutes one of the most interesting short-hole developments I have seen in recent years, and it is truly American. When you play these Briergate short holes you instinctively know that they are exactly what short holes should be.

The Briergate greens are the most extraordinary greens I have ever chipped to. The first look at them occasions surprise because of their unusual size. Your next experience, however, makes you wonder just why it is they are so hard to get on. It looks easy but Capt. Alison has fooled you by the ingenious manner in which he has guarded the greens in every instance, and yet in no two instances is this guarding accomplished in the same way. He has given the player, with his fast ball and efficiently-ribbed club, an ever changing problem. The different designs he has given the greens is an achievement in itself. The effect is delightful—the green has a chameleon-like effect in your play, in that it is always different, when you get upon it, from what you thought it was going to be. And I am glad Briergate is a Chicago club for another reason. Golf club memberships are as a rule far too costly. I want to see golf democratized. Briergate, with its reasonable membership, is a step in the right direction.

The officers of Briergate are William M. Reay, president; John E. Woodman, vice-president; W. P. Kelly, treasurer, and R. D. Hessey, secretary. These men have added more than a new golf club to the Chicago district. They have pointed the way to the great American golf links—in fact, I think they have built it.
