A FEW BRIEF ITEMS OF LAKE COUNTY NEWS

"HOCH" FOR POLICE CARS

North Chicago Celebrates 'Know Your Neighbor' Day; Other Happenings of Interest

Mrs. Fred Robinson, 1764 Highland avenue, Chicago, suffered a fracture of the right leg between the knee and ankle when an automobile her husband was driving crashed into a motor truck that had been drawn up at the side of Sheridan road a mile south of Zion City about ten o'clock last Thursday night.

There was a time when the Waukegan police destroyed all confiscated hooch. Many gallons of this liquor, taken from bootleggers, moonshiners and blindpiggies have found their way into the sewer.

But not any more!

A better use has been found for it.

When cold weather comes and the owners of automobiles in the city are fretting in their efforts to keep radiators from freezing, the police will go about complacently in their machines without a fear on that score. The confiscated hooch, which in many cases contains as high as 100 per cent alcohol, will be used in filling the radiators of the police cars and freezing will be out of the question.

With this purpose in view all confiscated hooch is being stored now and the indications are that there will be an adequate supply when cold weather comes.

Albert Meyers, 17, arrested recently on charges of having padded the payrolls at the Griess-Pfleger Tanning company, Waukegan, and also with having stolen an automobile, and who was in juvenile court Saturday, convinced the court that others were more to blame for the youth's mistake than he, and that he had been in bad company.

Judge Persons permitted the boy to return to the home of his parents, at 414 McKinley avenue, and gave him another chance rather than send him to a house of correction.

All offices, stores, and other places in North Chicago were closed tight at noon last Saturday. Practically everyone able to get to Foss park was out and taking part in the festivities. The day came to a climax in the evening when a fireworks display was put on at the lake front. Athletic events, a special baseball

game and dancing were features of the big "Know Your Neighbor" outing that was planned by the North Chicago Commercial Association.

Organization of the Lake County Radio club which has been going on in Waukegan has met with instant favor in many homes and as a result, the club is growing daily in membership. The present membership is nearly 200. The club plans to take in the entire county will be a cause for a larger membership, according to the organizers.

Zion—It would seem almost absurd and unbelievable that a white dove, bearing an olive branch—the emblem of peace—should give rise to battle. Yet this idealistic emblem caused a battle in the United States Patent office in the case of Voliva versus the Euclid Candy company. Wilbur Glenn Voliva, owner of the Zion candy factory, used the words "white dove" and a pictorial representation of a dove bearing a branch in its bill as far back as May 12, 1903, the same being registered at the United States Patent office as a trade-mark of Zion candy. The Euclid Candy company set up the use of this trade-mark August 7, 1915—just 12 years later. Voliva sought relief by appealing to the United States Patent office, and the Euclid Candy company was denied the use of the white dove bearing an olive branch as a trade-mark, and Voliva's objection was sustained.

In Zion the white dove is not only significant of peace, but it is an emblem of purity as well, so that this emblem is used on scores of Zion products.
