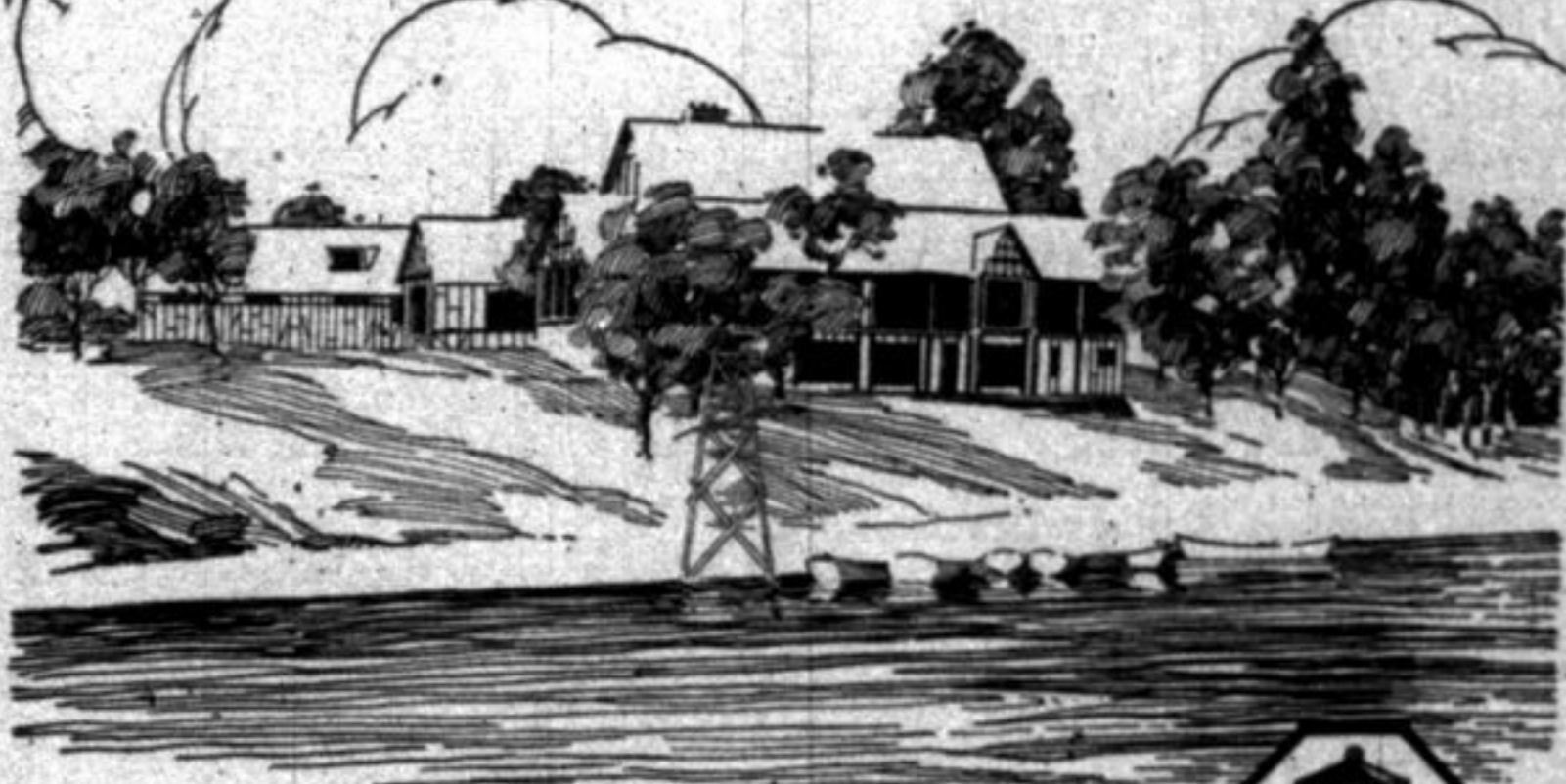

#### PREPARE GROUNDS FOR CHI-COOK FAIR

##### Checkerboard Flying Field Being Made Ready for Big Exposition

Checkerboard Flying Field at the intersection of Roosevelt Road and the beautiful Des Plaines river presents a scene of feverish activity as scores of men under the direction of Herman Schwake, president of the fair association and of the Cook County Farm Bureau, are preparing the grounds for the Great Chi-Cook Fair, which will be held Aug. 26 to Sept. 4.

The fair will utilize 350 acres of the Forest Preserves and is making plans to accommodate as high as 100,000 people daily. There are two large entrances to the fair grounds on Roosevelt Road and two on First Avenue. Advance estimates are that twenty acres will be under canvass.

Automobiles may enter the grounds on both Roosevelt Road and First Avenue, wide roads leading past the government flying field, race track and Midway to the hundred acres reserved for parking space.

At the north of the large tract reserved for the fair is the government flying field and near it are the buildings of the sanitary district. Light and water for the entire fair grounds will be secured from the sanitary district. To the west of the government flying field, horseshoe pitching courts are being laid out. Further west, in a beautiful grove on the Des Plaines river, a suitable picnic grounds has been provided for the Farm Bureau and other groups which will hold picnics daily. East and South of the picnic grounds, a plot will be fenced in for holding barbecues. On the river north of Twelfth street, the water regatta and Venetian Night carnival will be held.

A one-half mile turf race track is being constructed on First avenue. Grandstand seats for 15,000 people will be provided. A long Midway, including concessions, more than twenty-five big shows and riding devices, bands and other attractions, will lead from the race track to the various exhibits of live stock, agriculture, farm machinery, poultry and pet stock, women's work, etc. The Junior Chi-Cook Fair, the Radio Show and other exhibits will have large tents. The automobile show near the race track will require two large exhibits, each 80x320.

The Illinois Central will build a special fair station on the grounds and will run special trains direct to the grounds. One hundred Speedway buses will be on hand to transport passengers from the various stations at Maywood, Forest Park, Riverside, etc. direct to the grounds. Automobiles and busses will also help transport the crowds from Des Plaines avenue to the fair grounds.
