BOYS CAMP NEAR END OF 1922 SEASON

Assert Remarkable Progress
Made at Camp Roosevelt
This Year

With the final period rushing to its close, Camp Roosevelt stands on record as having attained its most successful season this summer. General health conditions have been excellent. The mess, which heretofore has been one of Major Beals' big problems, is this year one of the finest features of the camp. The splendid averages maintained in the summer school speak highly of the efforts of faculty, the calibre of instruction, and the application of students.

The morale of the camp in general is of a very high order. Being crowded to its maximum capacity, boys from 25 states being present, this feature in itself is remarkable. Major Beals attributes all of this to the new location.

"The move to our new location was the best thing we ever did," says Major Beals. "Being remote from outside influences, living more compactly, any deficiencies show up distinctly, and it has a tendency to make each one do his level best. Our splendid equipment and unlimited facilities have done much to make this summer the really big undertaking it has proven itself to be. I am highly gratified with the results accomplished at Camp Roosevelt this season."

The camp itself in every respect emulates a war-time cantonment. Nearly 80 squad tents are pitched on a plateau above the lake. Here the high school boys and their officers are quartered. The younger boys are accommodated in one of the old school dormitories nearer the lake, where they are under the supervision of a group of college men picked especially for the work.

Camp headquarters is located in an old barracks built for the accommodation of S. A. T. C., men during the war. Here are located the offices of the commanding officer, the adjutant, the finance officer and the camp newspaper. In the other end of the building are the old familiar "Y", the camp canteen, the post office and the quartermaster's office.

Although the camp is primarily military in organization, most of the cadets spend a good part of the mornings in classrooms, either making up

school work or securing advanced credit.

"Taps" are blown at 9:30 p. m., and "reveille" sounds at 6:00 a. m. every morning.
