CHICAGO POLICEMEN TO HOLD FIELD DAY

FINE PROGRAM IS PLANNED

More Than 500 Athletes Will Perform at Meet in Grant Park September 16 and 17

Chicago policemen will show their athletic prowess in one of the biggest and most picturesque Field Days ever staged in the Middle West. It will be held in Grant Park Saturday and Sunday, September 16 and 17 for the benefit of the Policemen's Benevolent Association.

Chief Fitzmorris is the directing head of the plans for the events in which more than 500 athletes of the force will participate. The Chief is being assisted by Martin Delaney, Manager of the Chicago Athletic Association, the Athletic directors of the city playgrounds and Superintendents of Parks.

Work has been started on the construction of a half mile track and a big amphitheatre to seat 25,000 in Grant Park and already many of the policemen are limbering up in the various parks and playgrounds.

In addition to the regular field and track events, which are being arranged under the supervision of Mr. Delaney, there will be many picturesque stunts, novel features and thrilling special events, which are being worked out by Chief Fitzmorris, Major Bauder, Capt. John Norton and Lieut. Smith of the Motorcycle Division.

Mounted policemen will engage in the exciting game of push ball—driving the giant sphere from one end of the park to the other on their prancing steeds. Another novel push ball event will consist of the use of flyovers instead of horses. The contestants will drive their Fords against the big ball, using the same tactics as the mounted men with their horses.

There will be tug of war contests both for men on foot and the members of the mounted force. A shuttle team race, which resembles the zig zag performance of the United States Naval Academy boys, will be another unique feature.

The motorcycle men plan to give some thrilling performances. Trick riding on a motorcycle is something few people have seen, but Chief Fitzmorris says there is a man on the force who will put circus performers in the shade by his trick stunts on his "Dare devil" engine. Sparring potatoes while riding at top speed on these speed engines and a barrel race for motorcycle men are among the other special attractions being arranged by the committee in charge.

Among the other special events will be wrestling, hand ball, contents, and trick riding by members of the mounted force, pitching quoits, acrobatic events, wrestling bouts by men on horseback, potato races, three legged race, obstacle race, wall scaling, sack race, water melon races, cocate tilting contest, horse races, band drill, motorcycle drill, mounted drill and physical drill to music of the police band.

The field and track events being arranged by Mr. DeLaney will include 50 yard dash, 100 yard dash, 220 yard dash, 440 yard run, 880 yard run, mile run, running broad jump, running high jump, pole vault for height, hop, step and jump, 16 lb. shot put, throwing 56 lb. weight, relay races of 440 yards, 880 yards and the mile.

Major Bauder, drill master of the Police Department, will stage a big review of all the performers to open the performance, similar to the grand parade of a circus. Led by the Chief and the police band and 500 uniformed men, the 500 or more athletes in their track suits will parade around the track as the big opening feature, which will start promptly at 2 p. m. A musical program also is being arranged by the police band and the police quartet.

A gold medal will be awarded to the winner in each event, a silver medal to the second and a bronze to the third. A silver trophy will be given to the unit scoring the highest number of points, another trophy will be awarded to the individual making the most points. The victor in each relay race will also receive a prize. All the entries must be in the office of the Superintendent of Police on or before Sept. 2nd.
