VAST EQUIPMENT REQUIRED FOR SERVICE

Public Service Co. Owns 111 Buildings Fully Equipped and In Operation

The Public Service Company to perform its service requires a vast and varied equipment. It owns 15 electric generating stations, 7 gas manufacturing stations, 24 electric sub-stations, besides store rooms, garages, district offices, water sub-stations and miscellaneous buildings. Altogether there are 111 buildings, the principal ones of which are constructed of concrete, brick and steel.

In these stations there are 55 generators, 11,000 transformers and also 4 big storage batteries in each of its largest stations. Steam is made from 90 steam boilers, with a total capacity of 35,650 B. H. P. For its electric generating stations the Company requires each year 400,000 tons of coal. It has coal storage capacity for 123,900 tons.

Nearly 150,000 poles are necessary to carry its aerial lines besides underground conductors, cables and conduits. Electric meters numbering 138,297 are owned, also 90,375 gas meters, besides thousands of meters to measure service to the Company's water customers. To meet the demands of new business it is necessary to buy each year 14,000 new electric meters.

In the Company's Gas Department the plant includes 16 gas holders with a combined capacity of 8,000,000 cu. ft. There are 24 steam boilers with a total rated capacity of 3,162 B. H. P. The storage capacity is sufficient for 11,775 tons of coal and 20,800 tons of coke. For enriching purposes in the manufacture of gas the Company consumes 8,000,000 gallons of oil during the year. The new gas business makes it necessary to buy each year 4,000 new gas meters.

An automobile fleet comprising over 220 vehicles ranging from heavy trucks to touring cars and speeders is employed in conducting the service. These automobiles work from various centers throughout the districts.

The company has 2,100 employees. The annual payroll exceeds \$3,500,000.
