### SMALL TRIAL COST LAKE COUNTY \$10,000

Bill Sent for This Amount to Sangamon County Last Week

The trial of Gov. Len Small at Waukegan on the conspiracy indictment in connection with alleged misuse of state funds while he was state treasurer, ending in his acquittal, costs Sangamon county \$10,073.25.

A bill for this amount sent by Lake county to Sangamon county whither the trial was moved from Springfield on change of venue insisted upon by Gov. Small, are as follows:

These figures do not include expenses in Sangamon county for grand jury and other costs before the change of venue was taken. Estimates of the total cost, made preceding the trial, ran as high as \$100,000. A \$50,000 figure was used by state administration politicians in the primary campaign round Springfield.

Announcement was made at the office of Col. C. R. Miller, director of public works and buildings, at Springfield, of the resignation of Arthur G. Brown, who acted as publicity manager for Gov. Small during the Waukegan trial, and who has been executive secretary for Col. Miller.
