EXPERT PRAISES BRIERGATE COURSE
(Continued from page 1)
161 acres and has utilized nearly all of it to the best advantage. The clubhouse, adapted from an existing house, has been cleverly remodelled for this purpose and makes a splendid club home.
Regarding the course itself, Capt. Alison said:
"The fact that the ground is comparatively flat makes it possible to arrange it satisfactorily: the architect can take the ground as he wishes and is not handicapped by topography. The short holes can be spaced out exactly as you want them, which lessens congestion. It is also possible to avoid weak-length holes. In Briergate there are no holes between 250 and 320 yards; they are all shorter or longer. This is a considerable advantage.
Varied Approaches
At Briergate also it has been possible to make the approach play more varied and interesting than on most courses. The modern ball is much more easily controlled than the rubber ball used 20 and even 10 years ago. It is possible to take advantage of the conformation of the ground and to accentuate it artificially where you wish. Very often nowadays a course that might have passed muster, with the old rubber ball is pretty dull work not exciting enough, and therefore it loses interest; the sporting chances are lacking. At Briergate we have been fortunate in the topography, because thereby we have been able to make the approach play highly varied and sufficiently exciting to suit the most exacting golf fan.
"Many Good Points"
"The Briergate course is a good one, a very good one," said Capt. Alison in concluding his interview with the editor of the Press. We are greatly pleased with it and believe it will improve from year to year, for age helps golf courses. The soil is good, topography excellent, the distances adequate and varied and the clubhouse a delightful one."
Captain Alison stated that work was begun by his company on the Briergate course in June, 1921.

GREATER SHERIDAN ROAD IS OPENED
Paved Highway Now Extends From St. Louis to Green Bay, Wisconsin
