

# Autumn Gardening Suggestions

**WHATEVER** transplanting there is to be done in the way of Trees, Shrubs, Evergreens or Perennials, there is no better time for such work than right now. A plant transplanted now will become re-established before Winter sets in by forming new roots ready to go ahead and grow by early Spring, a time when usually so many things in the Garden need attention which makes it difficult to get around to do all properly.

**PEONIES**, Iris and a lot of other Perennials after a three or four years' growth, are greatly benefited by being lifted in early Fall, divided and re-planted after the soil has been dug over deeply and a good dose of well decomposed manure has been worked into it. If left too long without being divided Peonies run out or won't flower as freely as young stock and that holds good with a lot of other plants in the hardy border.

**GRASS** Seed sown by the end of September or early October will germinate inside of ten days and usually forms a good turf before snow flies. Old lawns should have a good dose of Lime Phosphate, which acts both as a soil sweetener and fertilizer. A sowing of Kentucky Blue Grass on the bare spots well raked in and followed by a good rolling is also in order.

Every time you plant another little tree or shrub, you improve the value of your grounds that much and that holds good with Perennials.

**NO** better time than the present to do tree pruning, usually by far too much wood is left to remain inside of our native oaks, elms and other trees and it is the only time a maple should be pruned as such work done in Spring usually results in severe bleeding. Shrubs also should have attention, pruned into shape and the dead wood taken out, but to do any pruning always requires a man who knows how.

Overgrown shrubs are usually due to neglect and we often find five or six trees taking up the space one tree ought to have for proper development and you can't have a good lawn without care.
