## FORMER RESIDENT COMMITTS SUICIDE

### HENRY B. CLARKE DEAD

Takes Own Life at Redlands, California; Was Well Known In This Community

Highland Park friends learn with deep regret of the death of Henry B. Clarke, resident of this city until four or five years ago, and formerly vice-president of the Continental and Commercial Trust and Savings bank of Chicago, who committed suicide Saturday at Redlands, Calif., by cutting his throat with a jagged fragment of broken bottle.

The banker retired from his business connections in Chicago several years ago to take his wife to California for the benefit of her health, and they left Highland Park four or five years ago, removing to Redlands, Calif., where Mrs. Clark died September of last year, the change of climate having failed to restore her health.

The Clarks were married in Chicago in 1910. Mrs. Clarke was Miss Lulu Lovina Le Sage, a schoolyard sweetheart of the banker. The marriage followed a year after his divorce from Mrs. Harriet R. Clarke.

Born in Chicago Mr. Clarke, born in Chicago in 1867 received his education at St. Ignace's college, and began his banking career at the age of 17 as a messenger in the employ of the Hibernian Banking association.

His rise was a steady one, as he worked his way to the position of vice-president and director. After serving in this capacity for some time, he became connected with the Continental and Commercial Trust and Savings bank, of which he was vice-president at the time of his retirement. He was a member of the Exmoor Country club.

Several brothers and sisters reside in Chicago, and one brother, Louis B. Clarke, in Pasadena, Calif. During their residence in Highland Park the Clarks made many warm friends who regret it sincere at Mr. Clarke's tragic death.

Funeral in California. The funeral was held at the church of the Sacred Heart, at Redlands, at 2:30 Monday afternoon, and was private in character. Burial was beside the grave of Mrs. Clarke.

Mr. Clarke was the father of three children, Mrs. Keith McVaugh of Garden City, L. I., H. B. Clarke Jr. of Garden City, and Bertrand Louise Clarke, 10 years old, who is with her aunt, Mrs. C. F. Spaulding, in Chicago.
