Offered for Winning Infants in Second Annual Uptown Chicago Exposition in October

Three sterling silver cups valued at seventy-five dollars, fifty dollars, and thirty-five dollars for the first, second and third prizes, respectively, have been offered as an inducement for the parents to enter their babies in the baby contest to be held on the afternoon of October 16, in connection with the Second Annual Uptown Chicago Exposition. There will also be five honorable mentions for which five silver medals will be issued.

**Better Babies Movement**

"One of the main purposes of this baby contest," says George U. Gairing, chairman of the contest, "is to supplement and carry on the attention that has been directed toward the Better Babies movement, the natural consequence, of all previous similar contests. These contests have been a wonderful help in directing mothers everywhere to intelligent care of babies. Not more babies, but better babies has been the slogan of health authorities for the past number of years."

**Specialists in Charge**

Celebrated baby specialists have been selected to act as judges in their contests. They are Dr. A. Cosmon Gravey, 6000 Sheridan Road, surgeon to John B. Murphy and St. Francis hospitals, associate professor of surgery at Loyola university medical school, consulting surgeon, Municipal Tuberculosis Institute; Dr. L. D. Gregory, 4246 Sheridan Road, who is a physician at the Daily News Fresh Air sanitarium for babies and consulting physician of St. Joseph's hospital; Dr. Stephen R. Pietrowicz, physician in-chief of St. Mary's hospital, consulting physician of Cook county hospital and Tuberculosis Institute; and Professor of medicine at Loyola university medical school; Dr. Robert H. Hayes, 4602 N. Ashland avenue, assistant professor of medicine Chicago Policlinic, consulting physician of American, also Chicago General hospital and Illinois Tuberculosis association; Dr. James McCarty, Edgewater Beach hotel, pediatrician to John B. Murphy and Children's Memorial hospital, also house physician to Edgewater Beach hotel.

**COUNTY BUDGET IS \$487,350 FOR YEAR**

Supervisors Vote Appropriation Including Annual Receipts of About \$40,000

The board of supervisors has voted in favor of passing the annual appropriation bill totalling \$487,350, the amount expected to be necessary for the next year. As the receipts of the county from various fees and other sources, are estimated at \$40,000, the actual amount appropriated is \$447,000 the difference between the amount appropriated and the amount of the expected receipts.
